SCHOLARSHIP AT M. S. C.

The fact that over one hundred articles dealing with American colleges have appeared during the past year in the leading magazines indicates the high interest that these institutions hold in the public mind. These articles deal with all aspects of college problems, especially scholarship. At the recent meeting of college presidents at Atlantic City, scholarship was the chief problem for discussion, especially that of freshmen. There are perhaps three procedures now followed by colleges in the admission of freshmen which is in a sense the key to scholarship.

(1) Admission on certificate from high schools.

(2) Admission of the upper two thirds of the graduating class from high schools.

(3) Admission by the giving of mental tests in addition to the requirement of being in the upper two thirds of the graduating class.

I am venturing a few suggestions for the improvement of the scholarship at Michigan State College. These are only opinions based on observation. Perhaps I could not prove them statistically.

(1) I think the work of the freshman year would be improved if we had the semester instead of the term plan. This would avoid a certain waste of time that now occurs in changing courses each term and enable the new student to get down to work.

(2) The entering freshmen should have a common course of study for at least the first half year. The purpose of the first half year of work should be to determine a student's ability or inability to do college work and his interests in college life and work. By interests I mean not only academic but physical and social interests. I think it is true that the training a man receives in physical work has been very greatly underestimated in its power to form character.

(3) The instructors who teach the

freshmen during the first half year should be a very carefully selected group with a view to their special interest in that line of work.

(4) During the first half year there should be no rushing or plodding in order that the student might learn that his first obligation was to the institution as a whole, that teachers might know their men better, and that the institution might give in every way possible its aid in helping the student to get a start.

(5) All initiations into fraternities or sororities should be guided by one principle—that of giving the initiate the idea that he has joined an organization that stands for the best in college life. Therefore the initiation, though it might have an element of fun, should be worthy in every way of the ideals of an American college.

Each year a certain number of freshmen will fail to be able to do college work. Statistics have been compiled in a number of colleges on this subject. These statistics are not very illuminating. Perhaps the principle should be that a college should give the student a chance to enter those who wish to do college work in carrying out their plans, and should also the standard of scholarship especially in the upper classes to that point which will fit a man to do the work of a life that he aims to do.

Every freshman at Michigan State College is assigned to an adviser who acts not as a disciplinary officer but to help the student get oriented. The plan seems to be working reasonably well so that the individual student can get individual help. The number of failures among the freshmen is no greater than is necessary to maintain the standards of the college.

The greatest impetus that can be given to scholarship on any college campus seems to be that of the leading men and women throw their influence in favor of
