### HOOVER OR SMITH?

This choice must be made by the qualified electors of this country one neek from today, and inasmuch as the selection of the chief executive of the country is this year especially important, thougatful consideration should be given to the main-

portant thoughtful consideration should be given to the main state of the issues at stake before a decision is placed upon the ballot.

The campaign thus far has at times been clouded with superficialities, false rumors, brown derbies, and promises. There remains however two fundamental elements, that is the two ware. The largest volume them. parties and the two candidates representing them. Both must be in great part judged upon past performances and demonstration of capabilities. The Republican party has stood for certain principles, the Bemotratic coterie for others. The man selected is bound to uphold at least the major tenets of that group with which he is allied. In addition, each of the candidates must be influenced somewhat by their training, their preparation, and their close assertates. their close associates.

Among the most important principles espoused by the Re-Among the most important principles espoused by the Republican party is included that of protectionism, a tariff policy protecting American industries. The followers of Thomas Jefferson have traditionally upheld the dogma of free trade, which confidence foreign and domestic competition upon basic of competitive allowing them the benefit of cheap labor. As protectionists, the Republican organization believes in the American people receiving the highest wage possible for their services consistent with their power to purchase the commodities produced by them. Consumption of home produced articles of manufacture without competition from foreign produced articles. manufacture without competition from foreign produced articles

There is no way of preventing destructive competition except by building a tarif sufficiently high to off-set the low scale of wages being paid in foreign countries. The American workers wages being paid in loreign countries. The American workers are undernably able to produce more in a stated given time by the aid of improved machinery than the workers of any other nation. This greater possible production considerably off-sets the lower cost of production of foreign nations, but the extremely cheap labor of other countries still makes the productive

The farm question, which has been extremely prominent dur-The farm question, which has been extremely prominent during the last two years, can evidently not be solved by any artificial control through legislaton. The law of supply and demand is the controlling influence in the selling price of any commodity whatever its nature. However, the farmer is entitled to as much protection from foreign competition as is the manufacturer in any line of goods and the Republican party has always granted that protection through the teriff, but, perhaps not to the extent it should to put it on the same basis as the

It is manifest that Mr. Hoover will work to see that farm products are properly protected. From the history of the Democratic party it seems that they are not in sympathy with the protective dectrine. The question of disposal of the surplus of farm products is undoubtedly the ultimate keystone of farm relief. This must be controlled in some manner, must be destroyed or export. must be controlled in some manner, must be destroyed or export ed. Nevertheless, tariff will play an important part in reducing this surplus, in keeping the unneeded production of other countries from flowing in the markets of this nation and lowering prices. The policy of the democratic party has always been toward free trade which permits destructive competition on the part of foreign nations who may have a surplus crop. Such competition would mean that all farm products would have to meet the world price for any particular commodity, which would destroy not only the farmer of this country, but also the wage earner in any of the manufactured products of industry. earner in any of the manufactured products of industry.

The only time that the farmer could expect to benefit from his crops would be in those years when they were poor and the world ction was insufficient to meet the demands of consump or the home crop was insufficient to meet the home consump-tion. It would affect all other lines of industry because the farmer would not and could not purchase Business would stagnate without the purchasing power of the farmer's money.

The prohibition question is, to our mind, subordinate to the question of prosperity. The eighteenth amendment has un-doubtedly been a great factor in our prosperity; in the better-ment of home conditions; in the improvement of child welfare; The eighteenth amendment has unin the margin that it permits in savings; and in the general health of the nation.

Local option the state socialistic idea promoted by Mr. Smith, would not stop bootlegging, would not better present conditions for the reason that we would have dry states adjacent to wet states and vice-versa. The only result would be to shorten the haul of contraband from national borders to state borders. The bootlegger would still have his field of action; he would still have his profits in an illust trade. The solution of the problem is have his profits in an illict trade. may be surrounded with the best minds, highly educated men
and women, but in the end the decision must be his and it is

provincial in thought as Mr. Smith may be, or subjected to such influences as will be in close contact with him.




