73 YEARS OF ACHIEVEMENT ...

Today Michigan State college is observing the 73rd anniver-iry of its existence. Since the founding of the institution on lay 13, 1857, fur-reaching changes have taken place in the colsary of its existence. Since the founding of the institution on May 13, 1857, far-reaching changes have taken place in the col-

Sary of its existence. Since the founding of the institution on May 13, 1857, far-reaching changes have taken place in the college.

As a result of over a decade of diligent work on the part of a group of foresighted citizens of Michigan, the state legislature set aside 22 sections of land as a fund out of which the finances were derived for the establishment of the Michigan Agriculture college on its present location. J. R. Williams, a graduate of Harvard university and prominent in securing the founding of the institution, was appointed as its first president.

During the first few years of its existence, the college was limited to men students and agriculture was the main course of study. Only 73 students were enrolled when the school opened and at times during the early history of the college the enrollment with divided to but 48 students. After several years of hard struggle, the future of the institution was assured and improvements progressed more rapidly. In 1870 co-eds were admitted to the college for the first time. Since 1900 the college has developed greatly in equipment and enrollment until during the present year a total of 3000 enrolled students has been reached.

Few students of today realize the years of struggle that were necessary during the early history of the college. Numerous obstacles had to be overcome and as the Michigan Agriculture college was the first of its kind in the nation, other states watched the progress of the school. 




