"POOR SPORTSMANSHIP

At a time when the Interfraternity council is earnestly attempting to co-operate with college authorities to keep fraternity initiation periods as short and subdued as possible, action on the part of a certain number of the faculty in "throwing" unusually hard exams during "Hell Week" seems nothing short of poor

While it is notorious that a percentage of the faculty has no sympathy for the fraternity situation in college life, it would seem that mere common sense would show them that ungenerous conduct on their part will do little to solve the problem. fraternity initiations do, undoubtedly, have a poor effect on scholarship, but the difficulty is gradually being solved by groups such as the Interfraternity council. It can not be remedied in a day, but it is being invested. but it is being improved.

Such improvement is only taken at the insistence of the col-lege. Why then should faculty groups do everything in their power to embarrass the initiate by striking him in his weakest spot, his scholastic standing. It shows weeful lack of co-opera and is not an incentive to student help in remedying the

IN RESPONSE TO REQUEST

It is a long time since students of Michigan State have had a convocation. It is an even longer time since a man of out-standing ability and reputation has appeared at a convocation. This state of affairs has not existed without expressed student disapproval of State's lack of capable speakers for student

meetings.

It must be admitted that this disapprovavl is merited, for as the News has pointed out before, this campus needs the ideas and inspiration that nationally known educators with "young" ideas can bring to us. Neither can the college administration be blamed for refusing to bring such men, since student attendance at convocations have been notorious for its smallness and lack of extendance.

It may be assumed, then, that State is on trial, so to speak, in regard to its attitude toward interesting and worthwhile convocations. If the student body really wants them, as they have vociferously insisted in the past, let them demonstrate it by their attendance and interest. It not, let them refrain from criticism in the future when the college again refuses to bother

PRECAUTION

With the Michigan State administration taking swifter and more direct action on student affairs, it is expedient that the undergraduate body be more careful. As the college grows, so does the stringency of rule.

We can very well take a tip from our neighboring institution of learning, the University. Several years ago they were free-could roll about the campus in their cars just as we do now Then came two major accidents, several persons were killed and others severely injured—maimed for life. Within a short time, a ban on cars was clapped upon the students. Automobiles were banished not only from the campus itself, but students were prohibited to have them in possession at any time. Such was the fate of the University.

Traffic conditions on our own campus are becoming more acute each year. Especially at this season is grecaution the watchword of wisdom. If we wish to continue to enjoy the privilege of personal transportation, it behooves us to take care!




