EQUIPMENT FOR LAB HERE SOON

The furnishings for the sanitary engineering laboratory in the Oldshall annex have been delivered during the past week. It is expected that the laboratory will be in use at the time of the short course in chemical analysis of sewage for sewage plent operators to be held March 29-30. The laboratory course immediately precedes the sewage works operators' conference on March 31-April 1.

The equipment includes chemical laboratory tables with facilities for gas, air, and water, hoods connected for acid digestions, and incubators for samples. This was purchased from the Kewaunee Manufacturing company of Adrian, while the smaller apparatus was obtained from various samples are several to the content of the content of the company of Adrian, while the smaller apparatus was obtained from various samples.

The laboratory provides a place for special work in sanitary engineering work and for experimental work under E. F. Eldridge. Practical courses of a few days or weeks duration are to be given, since the rapid growth of sewage and water treatment plants throughout the state call for more trained men.
