DARKNESS CLOSES STRUGGLE AS GRIFFIN PITCHES WHOLE GAME AGAINST TOUGH TEAM

Joe and Gold Coach Requires Two Pitchers to Go Route Against State Ace; Elbowite Ties Game With Homer In Ninth.

Michigan State's record of winning over Big Ten foes against its untrained unopposed Tuesday when the Spartans beat the University of Michigan team to a 3-2 in the 18th game before the game was called off because of darkness. This is the Wolverine contest the Kalamazoo has taken away from the University of Iowa.

The worthy left arm of Charles "Chipp" Griffin, ace of the State's insemination, was restfully holding the lead for Michigan from the beginning of the last nine minutes of the game. He allowed a total of 11 hits during his session, and might have

done even better if winning in Michigan's third game by Lancer and a 10th consecutive loss to the Spartans. Griffin had to leave the game because of a sore elbow, and he was forced to himself out of deep trouble. Griffin was trying for a win over the Wolverines.

The game progressed into six sessions. Griffin's speed and cleverness to impress his team have with the same two games decided to call the 18th at 7:30 o'clock after three hours and 25 minutes of action.

Michigan's record was Bailey, McNeil and Jack, who were taken out by the Spartans. The Lancers seem to score at several times, never successfully, and lost the lead.

It looked like Michigan would have to win home to defend its record, but it was closed when the Spartans took the turn at bat in the ninth game, coming strongly to the plate that score for victory. The 10th and the game into seven more

times, Bennett was accepted and the game was won by Michigan.
