TIME-HONORED FRATERNITY INITIATION CEREMONIES ARE HELD BY HOUSES THIS WEEK

One Hundred and Seventy-one Men Take Informal Initiation as Hell Week Activities Get Under Way; Number Compares Favorably With Other Periods.

SEVERAL CHANGES CREATED BY SPARTAN ATHLETIC COUNCIL AT IMPORTANT MEET ON MONDAY

Contracts Abolished as Sweeping Revisions Made by Governing Board; Crowley Successor to Be Named From Among Horde of Applicants Early in February.

Two new policies in State athletics were adopted Monday night at the regular meeting of the college athletic council developing out of the discussions of the selection of Jim Crowley's successor as football coach here.

The council decided to refrain from trying to lure any coach here who is now attached to some other institution and to abolish making contracts with coaches, putting them on the same basis as other faculty members.

The council also decided that they would make no distinction in making a coach because he might have a certain style of play, but would "choose the man rather than the system."

Although applications are pouring into the athletic office with great rapidity, the council has decided to wait until the first of February to select the coach.

The choice of the 1933 coach will probably not be known for several weeks yet as plenty of time will be taken to select the right man.
