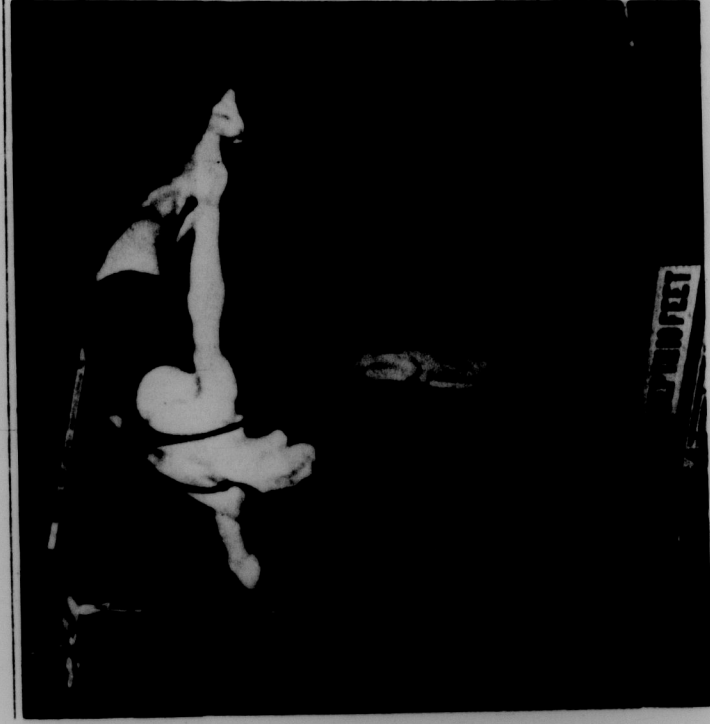

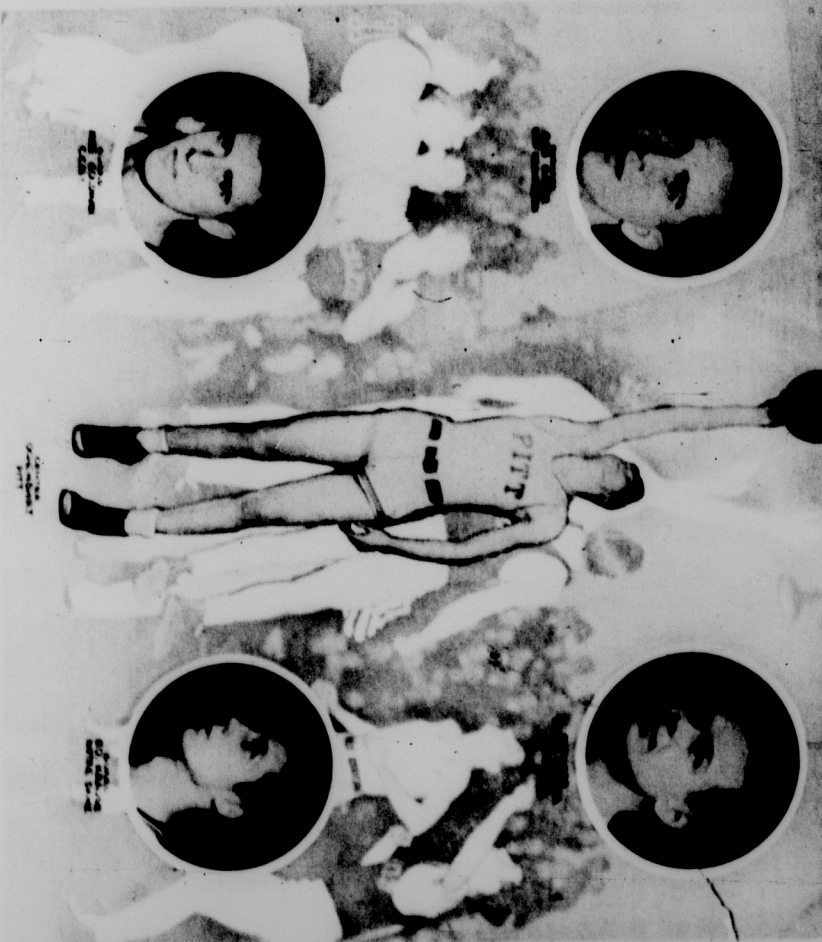

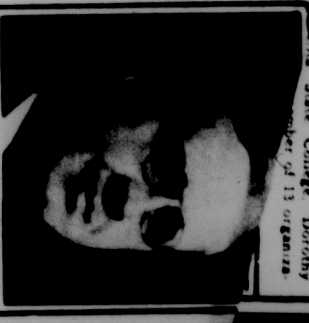

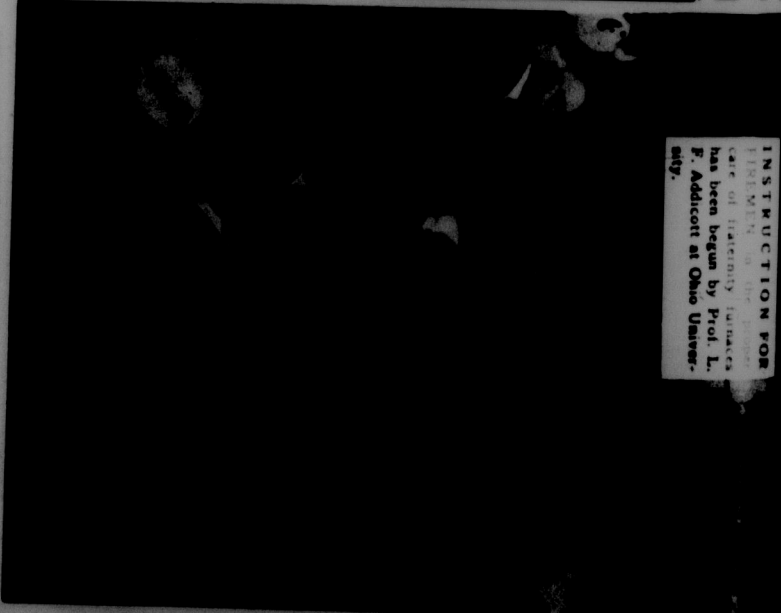

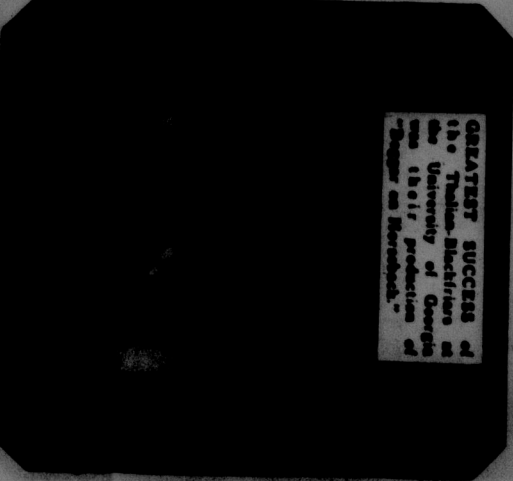

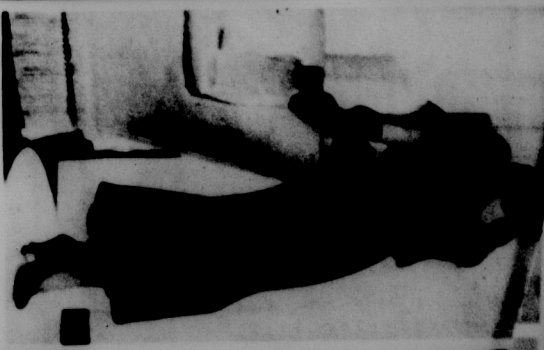
ILLINOIS NEW HEAD—Arthur C. Wilson, re-

nois, is shown in his home with Mrs. Wilson



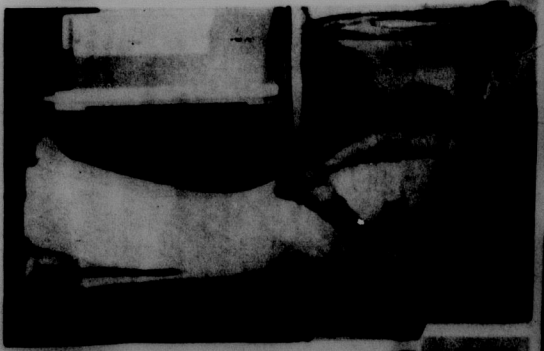

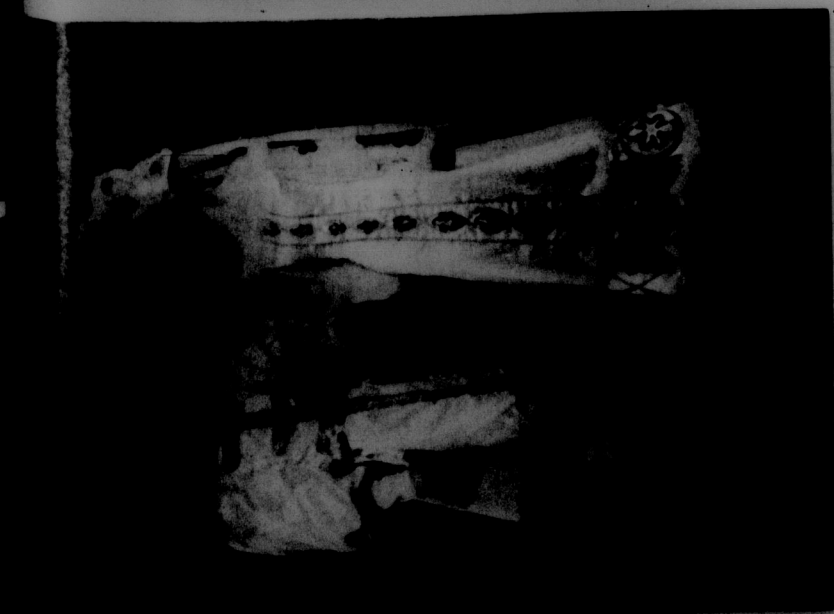

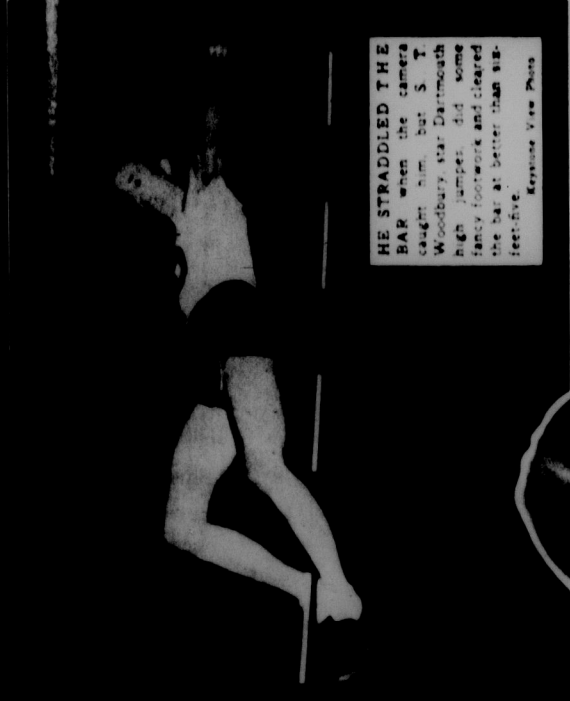

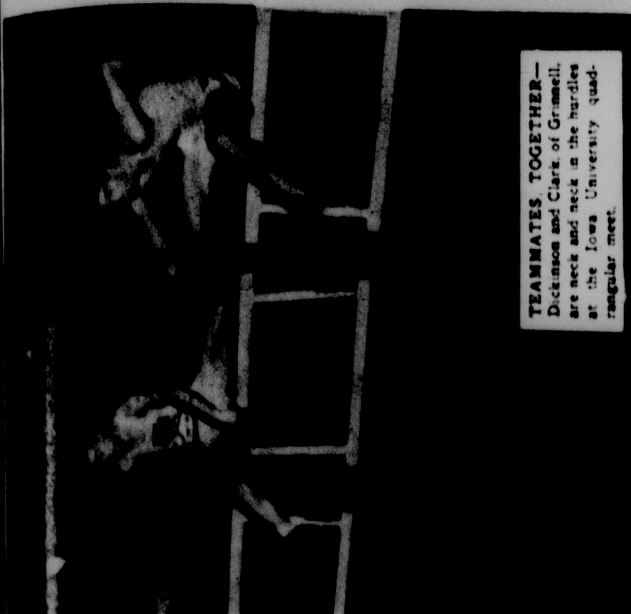

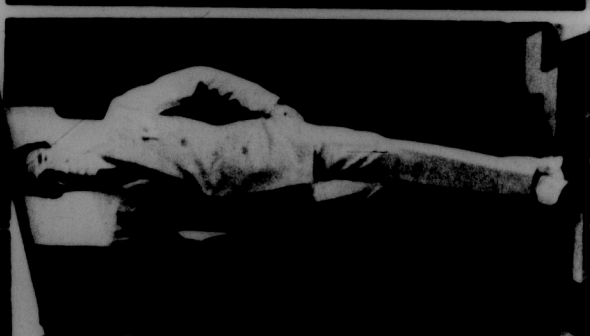

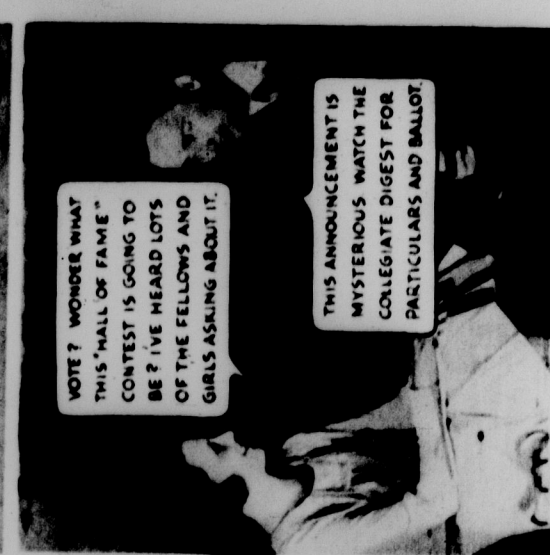
