










MAT CHAMPIONS—These are the winners of individual honors at Penn State's eastern championship meet.




GREATEST SUCCESS of the Thubus-Bloch firm is the University of Georgia man's bold production of "Digger on Herndon."



ILLINOIS NEW HEAD—Arthur C. Wilford, recently elected president of the University of Illinois, is shown in his home with Mrs. Wilford.








