Hell Week Passes

Hell week is no more. Gone is the period when class rooms were turned into flop houses, and rough-house and vulgar stunts made life miserable for pledges

The abolition of the term "hell week" by the Interfraternity council destroys the last estige of uncivilized informal fraternity initiations which were wiped out last January when the council amended its consti-

Fraternity week, for such will be the title of the period, will incorporate, beginning next term, two new features, a lec ture by a prominent local man on the implications of fraternity life, and a comprehensive examination, which every man taking informal initiation must pass, on the history of the college, the history of his fraternity, both national and local, and knowledge of other fraternal organizations

every pledy with more respect for fratothers as well as his own. The entire program should go a long way toward increasing the respect of outsiders for soc ial fraternities

Already the fine work of the council is reflected in the cooperative attitude of the administration. Several traveling officers of national fraternities have remarked that the local council is the most nearly ideal

It is especially commendable that fra men have seen fit to make these changes themselves, that they realize fraternities must discard rah-rah collegiatism and become a vital part of college life in order to justify their being, for such reeffective unless they come from within

Likewise, the Associated Women Students council, while not refusing to contribute, declined to take action on the proposal. Interfraternity and Panhellenic, councils simply declared, through their heads, that they had no money for such a venture. In fact, the only student organization which appeared favorable to the proposition, was the Union board. While no official action had been taken Wednesday afternoon, its president said that the board might be willing to contribute a sum.

This left direct solicitation of students and faculty members as the only means of raising the money. Although this might be possible it is doubtful that any of the four girls eligible for the trip will be willing to go if a collection has to be taken up in order to send her.

The Spartan magazine need not feel that its contest to choose "Sparty's Gal" has failed because it is unable to send her to Florida. The last issue of the magazine sold out because sorority backers of the contestants purchased them by the dozens. From the magazine's point of view it is unfortunate that it can not give the winner this additional prize, but, regardless, she will receive all that was offered her when the contest began. And the Spartan should not be too surprised that student organizations have ruled some difference between "The Spartan Girl" and "Sparty's Gal." SN-


