4re Freshmen Smart Enough?

The sole excuse for the existence of a ollege, says Robert Hutchins, president of the University of Chicago, and one of the nation's most progressive educators, to cultivate the intellectual virtues

In a recent magazine article, Hutchins tells how high school seniors and college freshmen may develop their minds and so acquire an education even though enrolled n a modern college whose avowed purpose is to teach social graces, athletics, and the art of making money, rather than to eduate its students. Hutchins says that all an entering freshman needs to get an eduration is a certain mental ability, habits of work, and the sincere desire to become

He then outlines a few practices that must be observed by the undergraduate who is resolved to become an educated Such a student must. Hutchins says, single out the few professors who are progressive and who stress education preference to hordes of more or less un related facts. Then, he continues, that student must take courses under these professors, and spend many hours in the library where the world's best books are patiently waiting to be read.

This is all very fine, and we are fully onvinced by Doctor Hutchins' writing that ne could acquire an education in a college ut is his idea very practical? That is are there many freshmen who know enough about education to win out despite the pposition. It must be assumed that students emerging from high schools deplored by Hutchins in previous writings have never been exposed to Hutchins' definition of education. How, for example, can a treshman raised on Colliers, Esquire, and popular novels know anything about the
