As a recapitulation of the many points to be considered, may I point out the following most important aspects of the necessity for an auditorium as soon as funds can possibly be made available?

1. There is no place with adequate acoustics in which the entire student body or even one-third of it can be seated at lectures, concerts, etc., for which every student pays a voluntary fee and is consequently entitled o admission.

Because of the inadequacy of all existing places used, it is impossible for those people responsible for these attractions to bring certain types of entertainment to the campus, such as symphony orchestras, ballets, and many of the finest lecturers who are now impossible to secure because of prohibitive expense of two lectures on the same evening.

Because of the lack of auditorium space, it has become increasingly difficult each year to schedule activities of the many departments who give public recitals, plays, etc., without a constant conflict in dates and rehearsal schedules. It has been a constant source of chagrin to me, for schedule of the Athletic Department using the Gymnasium. 


