We Should Keep Football King

Will Michigan State revise its football policy to the extent of reducing tickets to ten cents? This was suggested as a cure for a basic educational ill by Robert M. Hutchins, president of the University of Chicago.

Hutchins offers this suggestion as a method by which colleges may hasten their progress toward a reversion to intellectualism. He believes that the purpose of a university is to train minds of those students whose natural abilities are sufficient to make them capable of absorbing an education based upon metaphysics, mathematics, and the humanities.

many colleges accepting his plan. Hotchins says, "No-body wants or dares to defy the public, dishearten the students, or deprive alma mater of the loyalty of the

individual intellectual abilities or interests. Under present state college standards the more people they can educate, the better done will be their task and the greater

their services to the nation as a whole.

Since state colleges are aimed at the masses, it is only logical that they should use a publicity device that has strong appeal to the popular mind. Football is this device. The achievements of football teams are known to arouse more interest in college attendance than any other single factor. College football is the mode of entrance of higher education into the high school mind.

If colleges discard football or reduce it to the status of an extra-curricular activity and revert to intellectualism, what agencies will educate the masses? Certainly it is more important to give an incomplete education to thousands than to supply intensive intellectual activity to hundreds.

The state college can not seek loftier ideas of education until other agencies such as junior colleges take over their
