TO OUR BUS PATRONS IN LANSING AND EAST LANSING:

This is public assurance that services of the Lansing City Lines, Inc. will be maintained to the fullest extent permitted by circumstance.

This means that our service between downtown Lansing and East Lansing will continue without alteration, under our certificate from the Michigan Public Utilities Commission and the East Lansing City Council,

Over present routes, our buses will continue to operate on Michigan Avenue and along Saginaw Street, between the two cities. Patrons of our lines may, as they have in the past, board our buses at any corner or designated stopping place along these routes, and ride to the terminal point in Lansing or East Lansing.

We regret that the operation of a competing bus line, authorized by the Lansing City Council, makes it necessary that we discontinue the issuance or acceptance of transfers between our Lansing and East Lansing bases and city bases operating in the city of Lansing. It is unfortunate that the elimination of transfer privileges will involve the payment of a double fare. Our fare will, of course, continue at 5 cents, a rate which we originated in Lansing.

We trust that the public of Lansing and East Lansing will not lose faith. We came here in good faith, two years ago, to serve Lansing and East Lansing. We bought out the then existing bus system for \$175,000, gradually expanding our investment to its present figure of some \$300,000.

We regard present circumstances as temporary. Right will always prevail. We believe that through our efforts, Lansing has enjoyed the best transportation in its history.

Our first consideration has been the public. While this policy may explain our present circumstances of being ruled from the streets by the Lansing City Council, we are still strong in our conviction that the policy of serving the public is the successful one in the long run.

We have never sought to curry favor at the City Hall. In some quarters this has been regarded as a poor policy in Lansing, but it has never been found in any of the 21 other cities of the mid-west in which systems of National City Lines, Inc. operate today.

We have never been harassed by political machinations elsewhere; we have never before been confronted by City Hall intrigue. And while the experience is new; and not altogether pleasant, we still maintain our implicit belief that although "It CAN Happen Here", it can't last forever,

So, pending developments, we will maintain our service insofar as the action of the Lansing city government permits.
