But the fact remains that as long as we set marks as the criterion, not only of our ability but of whether we'll continue to stay in school ambitious students are going to aim for high ones at other students are going to cheat promiscuously rath

If we came for marks, and this applies to students trying to get through on D's as well as those seeking A's, by all means let us incorporate this fine and noble honor system so that those scoundrels whose sleepiness or poor alarm clock thwarts them from writing scholarly exams. 
