#### Students to Make Important Choice

Walking into voting booths at the spring term all-college final elections. Spartans will be faced with the problem of voting "yes" or "no" to a suggested form of student gov-ernment that will reach directly every student on campus. The proposed constitution is the result of efforts begun last fall term by Student council members

Object of this reorganization is to centralize student government into one organization, the Student council. Pre-viously Student council has labored under an obsolete con-stitution that gave it few responsibilities and little ability to present a true cross-section of student opinion. The Student council has been, in a sense, equivalent to Associated Women Students. Yet there was no central student governing agency. No one organization was truly repre-

Highlight of the plan is to remake the Student council so that representatives from "divisional councils" may vote for their classmates on any issue that may arise. Where divisional councils do not already occur, their for-

Also included in the plan is an entirely new "Men's council" which shall be made up of members of all campus men's organizations. A representative from this council such as YMCA and the Interfraternity c

Coed organizations already formed into Associated Women Students will, under the new plan, be parallel to the new Men's council. AWS will continue to be represented

ned, their selection being placed directly in the hand students at campus elections. Chief function of classicers will be, as in the past, to plan parties and sense

If stadents vote "ves" for the proposed constitution, the all be assured that the interests of every club and organisation, no matter how small, will be constantly defended
