New York Firm Gets Water-Conditioning Equipment Contract

In the only definite step taken during its regular bi-monthly meeting last night, the East Lansing council awarded a contract for water-conditioning equipment to the Permutt company of New York. Awarding of contracts for other equipment was postponed for further consideration.

Lengthy discussion of various and unrelated questions characterized the remainder of the meeting.

Investigation of plans for the building to be erected on the corner of Abbot road and Grand River avenue disclosed non-conformity with local building regulations.

A representative of the contractor, who is to construct the building presented his case before the council, but permission was refused by the aldermen until the specifications would meet the requirements of the local building code.

A five-page outline of a program for ridding the city of mosquitoes was tabled by the council and taken up at a later meeting.

An exchange of remarks between representatives of the Michigan C. Co. and the State C. Co. preceded action by the council on granting a permit to erect taxicab stands in East Lansing.
