

Council Seeks Approval of New Constitution

Following is the proposed Student Council constitution which will be presented for student approval at the all-college final election to be held Wednesday, May 27.

PREAMBLE
We, the Student Council, do hereby adopt this constitution for the purpose of organizing the college body and promoting the best interests of the student body.

ARTICLE I - Name
The name of the body shall be the Student Council.

ARTICLE II - Purpose
The purpose of this body shall be to promote the welfare of the institution and the student body.

ARTICLE III - Membership
The Student Council shall consist of the following members: Two representatives of the Liberal Arts division...

A primary ballot shall be set to elect the members of the Student Council. The primary ballot shall be set to elect the members of the Student Council.

ARTICLE IV - Officers
The officers of the Student Council shall be the president, vice-president, secretary, and treasurer.

ARTICLE V - Meetings
The Student Council shall meet on the first Monday of each month.

ARTICLE VI - Elections
The members of the Student Council shall be elected by the student body.

ARTICLE VII - Amendments
This constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote of the Student Council.

The relative number of votes cast for each candidate shall be announced. The candidate who receives the highest number of votes shall be declared president.

ARTICLE VIII - Powers
The Student Council shall have the power to recommend to the Faculty Council any student who is in violation of the Student Code of Conduct.

ARTICLE IX - Finance
The Student Council shall have the power to raise and expend funds for the benefit of the student body.

ARTICLE X - Final Provisions
This constitution shall be in full force and effect from the date of its adoption.
