The moral of the story is this:

Had the so-called "color line" been actively in effect at Michigan State, whether officially or not makes little difference, this particular student would never have started in this or any other line of endeavor.

14 is true that the judges who selected the winner were easterners and for the sake of argument less prejudiced than middle-westerners are supposed to be. But the final selection can be no criterion in this case. tion can be no criterion in this case.

The winning student necessarily received all coaching from M.S.C. instructors. And that extra encouragement that spells the difference between success and failure also came from fellow-students at State and the majority of it from members of a different race. If that encouragement and coaching had not been forthcoming it is reasonable to suspect that today's winner would have merely been one more member of an oppressed race.

Italy . . . an Enigma

One question which has been plaguing military observers Italian status in the event that Mussolini decides to enter

mbroglio. Italy has proved to be an enigma as to which side she will join in this ever-spreading war. If newspaper accounts emanating from Rome are to be considered, Italy and Germany are working together economically and otherwise. Em phasis is placed by many on the outward manifestations of cooperation which Il Duce and Count Ciano have encouraged. . The Italian press, government controlled has maintained

hostile attitude toward the Allies. Virginio Gayda, be-lieved by many to be the Voice of Il Duce, utters pro-German On the other hand it is known that the Allies and Musso

Ini have been dickering to ascertain what could be given to Italy if she stayed neutral. Recently Italian spokesmen reached by Il Duce, have demanded a great many colonial possessions including Tunisia, Djbouti, Minorca, besides de-inflitarization of Gibraltar.

It must be admitted that Italy has made more demands an she ever has hopes of obtaining-from Britain or France. Init has been told that these demands are preposterous and that France will pour her armies through northern Italy if the latter joins the Nazi power.

Into this situation steps Russia, which has cast covetous clances at Yugoslavia recently to the dismay of Italy. The otter has enjoyed great advantages with Yugoslavia. This coint is admitted by many to be important to Italy because Mussolini may join up with Hitler in order to check the Rus-

It is important to realize that only a few weeks ago Italy second to be wanting to remain a neutral. But as in the case of Scandinavia, the scene has changed. Mussolini seems to be checking his equipment and last minute details before pushing his country into conflict.


