## Seek Third Straight Over Hurons

Varsity tennis players will be seeking their third consecutive victory for their longest winning streak of the season when they meet Michigan Normal on the Spartan courts tomorrow at 3 p. m. Saturday the team will encounter a powerful University of Michigan lineup at Ann Arbor in a return match.

**Coach P. B. Sanson's** Ypsi squad lost a close match last week to a strong Kalamazoo team, the score reading 5-4, and showed up well against the University, losing only 6-3. State was defeated earlier this season by Michigan 7-2.

### TO MEET VETERAN

Bill Mastromarco, playing in the first position for the Hurons, will lead off against Morris Drilling, who has won his last two matches against Ball State and Kentucky. The Hurons are a veteran, playing in his third year on the varsity roster.

Either Frank Frogner or Charles Yellen, of Ypsi, will face Capt. Fred Perkins for the second "duel" on the card. Bill Swartz and John Lepisto are other top-notchers that Normal will pit against State's Bill Maxwell, Frank Beeman, Floyd Krause, and Irving Roberts.

### PRACTICE DOUBLES

Concentration this past week in practice session has been placed in doubles work, State having a worse record in doubles play so far this season than in any year since 1935. The third duo of the combination however, with Bob Harris and Floyd Krause in charge, has lost only two doubles matches the entire season.

### Missing from the traveling squad will be two members of the Spartan coaching staff.

Both Karl Schladerman, head coach, and Assistant Coach Fran C. Dittrich will remain behind in order to be present at the State Intercollegiate meet to be run off here Saturday.

### OPPONENTS RATE HIGH

Picked as one of the leading contenders for the IC-4A crown to be decided May 31 at Randall's Island, N.-Y., Penn State will undoubtedly cause State plenty of trouble in the quest for its initial dual meet victory.

At the head of the powerful Nittany Lions' aggregation is Barney Ewell, sensational sprinter and jumper. In its dual meet with

ALMA, Mich., May 21—A four-run rally in the seventh inning was the only offensive thrust a Michigan State reserve nine could stage here today, and as a result, Alma college, handed the substitute Spartans their second setback of the season, defeating them 5-4.

Although the Spartans won 7-3 in the first 1941 meeting between the two schools, such was not the case today as the Scots gathered six hits off three State pitchers to score in the first, second and fifth innings.

Bob Telder started against Alma for the East Lansing nine, but yielded to Roger Seaver in the fourth after the Scots had scored three unearned runs in the first two innings. Seaver yielded two runs on a brace of singles in the fifth and then yielded the pitching duties to Dick Bernitt in the seventh, who allowed the winning run.

Al Pears was the victim of the Spartan splurge in the seventh. It was in this inning that the second-string Kobsmen, countered four times on two doubles, a triple, a hit batsman, a base on balls and an error.

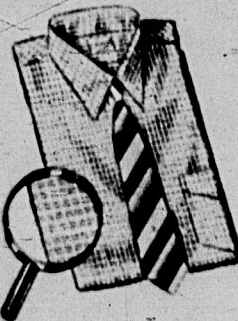

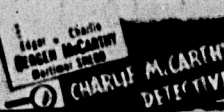
