Further damage also was done to the German and Halian positions at Halfaya Pass in northeast Libya.

The Akis stepped up its air attacks on the British Mediterraneon island of Malta where there have been reports that an enemy sea and air invasion might be attempted. On Tuesday Malta had 14 air raids, the largest number ever experienced in 24 lours. Only minor damage and a few casualties were reported.

of stage fright with amazing success. The position of many Americans today," he points out, "is analogous to that experiepced in stage fright. This situation, if permitted to continue, might lead to a deterior-ation of civilian morale."

Points to be remembered by all civilians during the crisis are:

1. Center your attention on your task-athand and seek new ways of helping.

2. Don't feel that the whole burden rests on you. Just do something, however small, and the net result will be great. Worrying about a situation dissipates

your energy, leads to more worry, and saps your efficiency for necessary work. 4. Don't expect too much. Prepare for bad news. It isn't the pain, but the surprise
