THE WAR TODAY

Allied reinforcements from the United States and Britain are en route to Singapore and the defenders of Britain's Far Eastern base are under orders from their supreme commander tonight to hold on at all costs.

As General MacArthur's crack fighting men on Batan peninsula hurled back new enemy attacks, attention was focused on the Singapore area where American fighting men soon will be in the thick of the battle.

In Singapore

News of the reinforcements was given today by General Sir Archibald Wavell, Allied generalissimo for the Southwest Pacific, General Wavell, in an order of the day to the defenders of Singapore, told the empire forces that their chief task was to gain time for the reinforcements which now are enroute.

Meanwhile the actual military situation remained unchanged. As Jap planes continued their heavy attacks on Singapore island, British artillery shelled the Jap land forces across narrow Johore Strait. Jap batteries failed to reply to any of the British barrages.

In Dutch Indies

The Japs also continued their air raids on scattered sectors of the Netherlands East Indies. However, the Dutch garrisons at many points where the Japs have invaded continued to offer stub-born resistance and authoritative Dutch quarters denied Japanese boasts that the whole of Borneo now was under Nipponese control.

In Russia

The Russians reported new gains on the eastern front with the recapture of several additional towns, and villages. No place names were given, but the heaviest battles were understood to be in progress in the Donetz Basin.

In Libya

British empire forces have made a further withdrawal in Libya, learing the coastal port of Derna in the hands of the Axis. However, the British still are in contact with the enemy.






