THE WASTE THAT IS WAR hasn't begun to be felt here yet. True, at least six Michigan State graduates or former students have been involved in airplane crashes or torpedoing. This is a tragic thing, but is small compared to the tragedies going on every minute in Europe.

TODAY, WITH THE WAR FAR from a decision, losses are mounting in Europe and Asia to horrible proportions. Day after day, those "heavy losses," "inflicted num-erous casualties," and other headlines mean grief for many, many families;

THE RUSSIANS CLAIM one out of every five German men has been put out action on the freezing, typhus-ridden Eastern front, They say that every hour 300 German beys die because of a paperhanger with delusions of persecution. What the Russian losses are is not known, but they are not light.

BRITAIN JUST HANDED several new warships over to the Free Greek government to be operated by Greek sailors. This famed British navy is feeling the weight of loss of valuable manpower. Jap losses are going to be much, much heavier.

NOTICE THAT the latest wave of torpedoings has been almost entirely of tankers. This probably means (we things: 1) The Nazis may be short of torpedoes and are using them only where they do the most good, but 2) the oil shortage here and in Britain is going to be much worse.

ONLY 50 tankers transferred to transocean use last summer brought gasoline rationing to the east coast. At the present rate of sinking rationing will be coming to stay. All of England's oil is coming from the Western hemisphere.


