Anyone who does not obtain a ration book during the regular registration will have to wait two weeks, and then manapply to the local rationing board.

By using their regular customers' coupons they can have this base quota increased.

Students under 18 are registered by parents, and their quotas may be applied to the family totals. A further need of students obtaining rationing books is to obtain sugar when at home, O'Hara pointed out.


