

WASHINGTON .- The President has been given some blunt advice to deliver a "fireside chat" to explain the much pemuddled rubber and gas situation.

The advice was given at a recent White House conference by Donald Nelson, Leon Henderson, Archie MacLeish and Undersecretary of War Pat-

terson, all of whom agreed that the people had been so confused by conflicting official pronouncements that only the President himself could clarify matters and explain why na-tional rationing of gas is essent-

ial.

The answer to this is so simple that it seems fantastic that it han't been got over to the public. There is plenty of gas in the U. S.—except along the Atlantic seaboard—but real crux of gas ra-S.—except along the Atlantic sea-board—but reat crux of gas ra-tioning is the desperate shortage of rubber. That is the whole story






