ALLIED HDQ. IN NORTH AFRICA, March 30 (AP)-Gabes and El Hamma fell to the triumphant British eighth army beating swiftly. up the Tunisian east coast to-American columns driving toward the sea against the escape corridor.

Rommel's rear guard maintained stubborn resistance, and his sappers planted thousands of mines and booby traps to cover the withdrawal, a retreat that had no aspect of a rout.

On the Axis left flank, American forces were smashing at enemy machinegun outposts in the mountainous area east of El. Guetar, and other U.S. troops in the Maknassy region builed back three German counterattacks designed to give Rommel elbow room on his retreat,
