

Reds Continue Gains on Smolensk Front

LONDON, Thursday, April 8 (AP)-Russian troops captured two more localities on the Smolensk front, and destroyed nine German guns and three blockhouses and dispersed an infantry concentration on the Donets defense line in the Ukraine, Moscow announced early today in its midnight communique.

The communique, recorded by the Soviet monitor, said the Germans had suffered heavily in the last few days trying to crack Russian lines near Izyum, 70 miles southeast of Kharkov.

WASHINGTON, April 7 (AP)

A warning that hundreds of schools will have to close and additional hundreds will be forced to curtail drastically their curricula, unless federal aid for the states and territories is forthcoming, was sounded today by 25 representatives of schools and educational organisations.
