Spartan Football Season Schedule Will Open With Double Header

First of the campus league football games will be Sept. 25 when four of the five teams meet in a doubleheader at Macklin field. Athletic Director Ralph H. Young said yesterday.

Vet students, AST men living on campus, ASTs living off campus, air force enlisted men, and civilian students will make up the five teams, Young declared.

Plans for the cross country season which will start about the same time are also being made. Agnewmen, in addition to the other groups on the campus, can compete in that sport. Full 25 men teams are expected to compete in running a two mile course, he added.

Coaches from the athletic department will be assigned to all of the teams. Those assigned to direct the football teams will be Charles Bachman, Al Kowal, Joe Holsinger, John Kots, and either Gordon Dahlgren or Karl Schladerman.

Leading cross country workouts will be Louie Brown, Frank Dahlgren, and Karl Schladerman.

Army teams will start their practice on Sept. 6 and continue through the season. The civilian team has had three weeks of practice, consequently they won't be too far behind, Young declared.

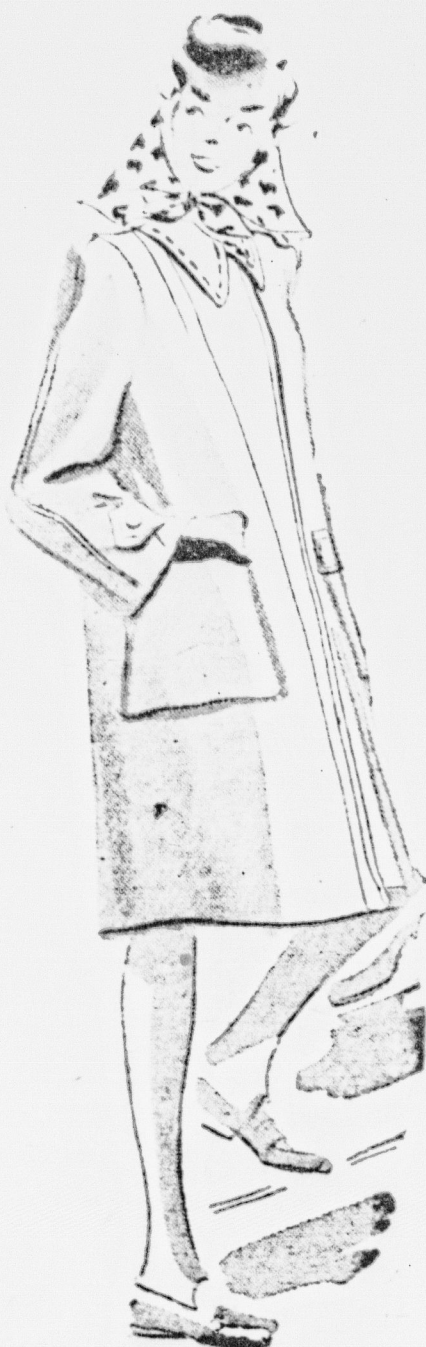
