Third Army Nears Saar, First Plows Into Rhine Area

SHAEF, PARIS, Nov. 17. (AP)-The U.S. third army loosed its armored might across the Moselle north of embattled Metz for the first time time today and sent tanks charging five miles east to little more than two miles from the border of the Saar industrial basin, an important source of Germany's war might.

This surprise blow fell as the U.S. first army to the north, attacking under a thundering barrage from 1,000 guns, plowed for ward two miles to a point 14 miles inside Germany and only 28 miles short of the Rhine.


