

New Techniques for Pigment Properation

As many commercial pigments are now made, they are precipitated from chemical solutions in the form of fine particles, which are then dried, ground and reground with a liquid vehicle to pro-duce the final point, enamel or lacquer. The fineness of the particle size largely determines the luster of the finish. Although mechanically ground pigment particles can be made extremely fine, they are not nearly as small as the parturies originally precipitated
