LONDON, Jan. 7.—P.—A government source said today that Foreign Secretary Ernest Bevin and Colonial Secretary Arthur Creech-Jones had decided to recommend to the cabinet that Palestine be divided into independent Arab and Jewish states.

Such a division would possibly reserve Jerusalem and possibly other territory as neutral areas under British trusteeship, the source said. The cabinet is to hear the recommendation at a special meeting Thursday.

Both Bevin and Creech-Jones were represented as having "decided in principle" that the only hope of bringing peace to Palestine lay in the creation of separate states. Officials of the foreign and colonial offices were reported to be drawing up several variations of a partition plan for cabinet consideration.

Truman Picks Marshall As Secretary

Government Faculty Expresses Split Seen Over Taxes

President To Give Recommendations To Congress Today

WASHINGTON, Jan. 7 (AP)—President Truman headed straight for real trouble with Congress on his ideas for running the government.

At noon tomorrow the field of conflict may be further widened when the President submits recommendations for avoiding depression and working instead for prosperity.

Already these difficulties had arisen for Truman in his efforts to get his program through the new Republican Congress.

He reports that the President will submit a \$37,000,000,000 budget for the fiscal year beginning next July 1 around GOP opposition Chairman Teller (R., N. Y.) of the House appropriations committee figured \$29,500,000,000 enough.

The President's budget message according to some officials could produce a surplus of not more than \$1,500,000,000. He wants the surplus to be used to reduce the national debt of about \$10,000,000,000.

Some Republicans argue that with stringent economies it will be possible to cut most individual income taxes 20 percent, and still have money left over.

If I Had A Million

AT MOST TWO YEARS AGO, OWOSO citizens shook their heads and muttered, "It can't happen here, but if it does, one of their leading industrialists, a 50-year-old millionaire, had sold his business down to the last bolt—and gone off to Michigan State college."

Here was a bolding, balding, grey-haired millionaire who was exerting a near-term about play. At the time of life when most men, especially those with a million or two, are thinking about retiring among the flowers and beauties this guy was turning schoolboy. Freshmen were startled when the man they presumed to be the professor turned out to be just another troh.

When I first heard about this riches-to-rag-bound combination, I thought here is a case that even an army psychiatrist

could solve. That is, I did until I met this unassuming character. And now that I know Al Redmond and know a little of his story, I can't help but admire him for his courage.

Thirty-five years ago Al was bitten by the automotive bug, quit high school to become an auto draftsman in Indianapolis. When he was 20 and had been working several years, he decided to set up a life plan. He set definite goals for himself at 30 and at 40, and decided, at 50, no matter what he was doing, he would stop and start all over again.

With over a million dollars to his name, one might argue that Al's decision to stop and start all over again at the half century mark wouldn't be too hard to take. However, if we're 50 and had an extra million lying around, I can think of a lot of things I'd rather do than go to college.

So this last of the automobile industry's Horatio Alger built from scratch a thriving electric-motor industry—the A. G. Redmond company of Owosso. The year he sold out, Al's firm had boosted production output to an all-time high of 15 million dollars per year.

Al didn't sell out and go to college because he wanted to learn how to "appreciate life." He did it because he developed a strong realization throughout the years that a college education is a "must" for future success in industry or business—both socially and economically.

"I think I was among the last to achieve any substantial degree of business success without a college education," Al commented recently in an article which appeared in the Owosso Argus-Press. "I was fortunate in a great many ways."

Learning how to study at 50 is probably harder than trying to be a millionaire at 20. However, Al evolved a question and answer system that has paid off with a near three point average.

Right now, Al is enjoying winter term in Florida, but will be back spring term to begin work as a minor in his major—social sciences. And when he graduates from Michigan State sometime in the next two years, Al plans to begin a new career, this time, he thinks, in personnel management.

Michigan State took seven of the eight events, losing only the 50 yard free and 150 yard backstroke. Charles Keating, manager of the Cincinnati team, edged State's James Duke of Michigan State in the freestyle race, setting a new meet record of 23.7 seconds.

The other Cincinnati winner was Bob Stacey, who captured a swimming event in the new season record time of 1.46.8. Allen Gandy, honorary captain of State, placed second, with a time of 1.47.4.

Congressman Says One Million Civil Employees Will Go

WASHINGTON, Jan. 7 (O.P.) — Rep. Taber (R-N.Y.), chairman of the House appropriations committee, threatened tonight to use a sledgehammer on President Truman's expected proposal for a \$37,000,000,000 budget. Taber called for lopping 1,000,000 employees off the federal payroll.

Signalling the first major clash between the Democratic administration and the Republican-controlled Congress, Taber told newsmen:

"If the President presents anything like a \$37,000,000,000 outline for expenditures next year, we will use a sledgehammer as well as a meat ax to bring down that figure."

"My budget figure is \$29,140,000,000," Taber said, "and I haven't changed it."

Balanced Budget

"We are going to cut down government expenditures to a point where the budget can be balanced, a payment made on the national debt, and we will still have room to reduce taxes."

Temporary Aid To Vets, Small Business Cut

WASHINGTON, Jan. 7 (O.P.) — The Office of Temporary Controls wiped out today most of the priority system which was set up to assist industrial reconversion after the war and to aid veterans or small businesses to become established.

The action lifts military priorities as the principal preference ratings supported by the Federal government in obtaining material and equipment. Home building priorities were abolished previously.

The civilian production division of OTC announced, however, that these features of the civilian priority system were being retained:

1. Priorities for items needed to fill military orders which can not be deferred without serious results to the defense program or to the health and welfare of enlisted personnel.

3. Priorities for material or equipment required in connection with the veterans emergency housing program to maintain or increase production of a building material or product which has been determined to be in critically short supply.
