## Union Claims Phone Seizure By U.S. Illegal

WASHINGTON, April 4 (AP)—

The possibility that a nationwide telephone strike may occur even if the government seizes the industry arose tonight when the union leadership challenged the government's seizure powers.

Joseph A. Byrne, president of the National Federation of Telephone Workers threatening a strike Monday said Attorney General Clark's opinion that President Truman has legal seizure authority is "contrary to the opinion of our legal counsel."

Byrne left open the question whether the telephone workers will stay on the job if the President takes over the industry.

Clark had ruled earlier that the president may exercise war powers in the federal communications act to seize the industry.

After a meeting of the NFWA policy committee Byrne told reporters.

"The Attorney general's opinion is contrary to the opinion of our legal counsel. He is stretching the law to the breaking point in handing down such a decision. If seizure is decided upon by the president we will then determine what action is to be taken."

## New Dorm Will House Civilians Next Fall

Some six-hundred civilians and veterans will be able to consider themselves in the dormitory-living class next fall term. E. G. M. manager of dormitories, stated that barracks and other construction entanglements the unfinished new dormitory, Phillips hall, will be finished in time for fall term occupancy.

Veterans now fill Snyder hall, hall of the dormitory that was slated for spring term; however, residents of Phillips will be approximately 300 civilian and 300 veterans, revealed E. G. M. director of student housing. At the present time, veterans have priority on dormitory but after the new Phillips has been filled, new residents will be admitted by date application, he added.

After duplicating its predecessor, Mason-Abbot, Snyder-Phillips will have a normal room occupancy of three, although small dorms may have only two residents. Facilities such as plumbing, electricity and cafeteria service are expected to be finished fall.

Plans are in the making for two dormitories for men, Mackinac, and another has been designed just as far as imagination goes, but has not been definitely decided upon.

Following the reception, members of Union Board will elect the future Board members for next year. The petitions were considered on a basis of class, all-college average, present activities, previous experience, and special interests and abilities.

## U.S. Aid To Greece, German Plebiscite Deadlocks UN

MOSCOW, April 4 (AP)—Ambassadors and envoys declared tonight that the foreign ministers were deadlocked on reports of a major issue upon which settlement of the German plebiscite depends, that the economic committee had given up trying to find a compromise and had ceased to meet.

This disclosure came as Soviet Foreign Minister V. M. Molotov in answers to a series of questions expressed doubt that President Truman's proposals for Greece would restore democracy to that country. Molotov called for a hands-off policy on Greece.

Molotov commented that the "danger" that American plans for Germany, political organization would lead to her dismemberment, but added that he felt it was possible to reach a compromise on the future form of a German government if the question of federalization could be decided by a German plebiscite.

## Red Cedar Level Doubtful As Rain Drenches State

If river rises throughout the state of Michigan follow the promised rain, then hopes of seeing the Red Cedar at a normal level may be delayed.

Merrill H. Wills of the East Lansing weather bureau stated that the Cedar dropped two-tenths of a foot early Friday. At present no predictions have been made concerning future level readings.

There are also no damage predictions. Henry L. Chipman, superintendent of Red gardens mentioned that the water does a certain amount of damage to plants but the large flower section of the garden is still above water level.

### Reynolds Plans Globe Flight

NEW YORK, April 4 (AP)—Pen manufacturer Milton Reynolds will take off from Newark, N. J., on a round-the-world flight, probably around 2 a.m. tomorrow, it was announced late today following approval of New York city authorities to permit use of any municipal airport.

### Sigler Apologizes To Group

LANSING, April 4 (AP)—Implying that he had been led into the matter deliberately by unidentified members of the Michigan State Gov. Governor Sigler today made a public apology for calling the Youth Council for Youth Service a "communist front" organization.

### First Portal Case Withdrawn

CINCINNATI, April 4 (AP)—The government withdrew from the C. C. Potters Pottery company portal test case today after Attorney General Tom Clark was advised that the principals had agreed to an amicable dismissal of the suit.

### Hughes To Fly Jinx Ship

SILVER CITY, Cal., April 4 (AP)—Howard Hughes' FX-11, a prototype of the plane in which the movie producer-plane builder hopes to make a record, will be test flown tomorrow, a spokesman announced today.

Hughes probably will be at the controls, he said.

### Paratrooper Proves It's Easy To Fly

MEMPHIS, Tenn., April 4 (AP)—Russell Herford, 22 year old former paratrooper who is paralyzed from the waist down, has obtained a license to fly an airplane.

The Thornfield, Mo., veteran, a patient at veterans hospital here, passed his flight test yesterday. He started lessons Oct. 21, 1946.

Herford was wounded in the spine while serving with the 81st parachute regiment during the Rhine offense.



## Christ Broke The Path

It's strange, isn't it, to think of God's becoming man? — To think that He was born a helpless infant, just as we are born helpless infants; that He grew from childhood to manhood; that He ate and drank, shivered, and perspired; that at times He got tired and sat down to rest; that He died and was buried like any other son of man.

He did it. He told us, to be our example in all things. And that's the key to His resurrection — the significance of Easter. If He was our example in life, then He was our pathfinder in death too. We can't believe that He set aside His humanity at the resurrection. The tomb was empty. He had His human body with Him. The difference is that it was now glorified.

Notice how the apostles were tempted to believe that He was no longer man; but our Lord pointedly ate dinner with them to show that He was still human, because everyone knows that a ghost has no stomach. Another time, He had St. Thomas push his finger into the nail-holes and drop his hand into His side. You can't feel a ghost, and Thomas seemed to have been satisfied

that it was his friend, Jesus Christ, for he dropped to his knees at once and cried out "My Lord and My God."

Then this is our ordinary human destiny: to be born, to die, and to rise again. That is the only conclusion we can logically draw, especially in view of our Lord's assertions during His lifetime: "I am the resurrection and the life; he that believeth in me, although he be dead, shall live; and everyone that liveth and believeth in me, shall not die forever" (John, 11:25, 26).

Our Lord might have switched — He might have changed from man to God; He might have left His body in the grave and flashed over the hills and lakes of Galilee like the lightning appearance of God in the Old Testament — but no, He takes with Him the body we know, the face, kissed by Judas, and the feet anointed by Magdalene. It is the same Jesus before and after. So that if His previous life was like ours and a pattern for us, then His present glorified life, His risen life, is a token, a pattern, a demonstration of what we are destined to experience in the life to come.

## Constitutional Amendments To Students Wednesday

Locations of voting booths for Wednesday's Student council election have been announced. Each of the men's and women's dormitories will be open for this purpose at meal time, and a booth will be open in the main lounge of the Union between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m.

Before the students vote on the proposed amendments to the Student council constitution, which are intended to increase representation in this organization closer to students. The old method of electing council representatives from various schools of the college will be abandoned if the amendments are approved.

The proposal provides that the council will be elected on the basis of living quarters. One representative would be elected for every 100 students in each of the dormitories, divided as follows:

All fraternity houses, all sorority houses, Abbott-Mason hall, Snyder-Phillips hall, Maye hall, Quonset village, student's quarters, C. O. Hall, Landon hall, Co-op house, East Lansing area and Landon area.

The proposal would enlarge the council from the present 25 members to approximately 43.

The amendments involve the procedure for electing officers, scholastic standards for council members, and matters of a technical nature.

To prevent illegal voting, voters will be given a ballot on the hand with an ink stamp by an election official.

Amendments to be voted upon are listed below as stipulated in the Student council constitution, Article 10, section 3. Copies of the constitution as it exists at the present time may be obtained at the Council office, Room 108, Union Annex.

Amendments to the Student council constitution, passed Tuesday, March 11:

Section one: The Student council shall consist of duly elected representatives as stated hereafter in the constitution. It shall have such other powers as stated in the body of this constitution.

Section two: Representatives to the Student council will be elected from the following districts (see above): Any changes in districts or additional districts that the Student Council Election Rules Committee may deem necessary shall be employed.

Section three: (a) The number of representatives from each district shall be one for each three hundred students, and not more than four from any one election district.

(b) When the number of students in an election district is less than three hundred, but more than two hundred, the representative shall be elected, and when the number is two hundred students more than any multiple of three hundred, an additional representative will be elected, providing the total number of representatives from that election district is not more than four.

Section four: (a) The number of representatives shall be one for each three hundred students, and not more than four from any one election district.

Section five: The president of the Council of Associated Women Students and the president of the Men's Council shall serve as members of the Student Council.

Section six: Should an elected representative change his place of residence during his term of office so that he is no longer in the same election district, he shall be required to resign, and the candidate having the most largest number of votes in his election district will succeed him as representative for that election district. In the event that no other candidate is available, the Student council will make provisions to duly elect a new representative within four weeks after his resignation.

Section seven: Candidates for the office of president shall be elected by ballot on the day of the election. A second ballot shall be cast on the day of the election if the first ballot fails to elect a president.

Section eight: The district representative shall be elected by the Student Council upon assumption of office. He shall be filled by the person who has the highest vote in his district.

Section nine: (a) Eligibility to hold office and to vote in class elections shall be based on the student's standing as defined in the following classification: Freshman—12-13 credits; Sophomore—14-15 credits; Junior—16-17 credits; Senior—18-19 credits.

(b) For determining eligibility for voting for Student Council, the student's standing shall be based on the beginning of the semester following the election. In any term between spring term and fall term, the person elected shall hold office for the remainder of the term, in the case of a fall election, or the following.

Section ten: (a) Eligibility to hold office and to vote in class elections shall be based on the student's standing as defined in the following classification: Freshman—12-13 credits; Sophomore—14-15 credits; Junior—16-17 credits; Senior—18-19 credits.

Representatives of a tall company who had been standing by for the end since the whale negotiated the narrow ferry channel in from the bay yesterday slipped a towing line around Blackie's tail and began the task of towing him via tug to their plant for rendering into fats and oils.

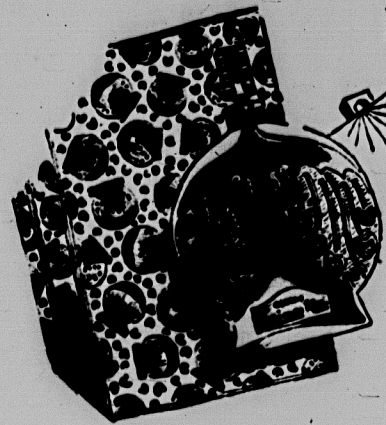
