

Last month in this space the develop-ment of nylon was traced from a funda-mental research study on linear polymers to the first synthetic organic fibers, the superpulyamides. This installment deals with the complex manufacturing re-search problems that followed.

Information was acquired only by painstaking experimentation at each step.

The process as finally developed for the manufacture of nylon and its fabrica-tion into yarn may be briefly outlined as follows:






