WASHINGTON, April 29 (P) — The House voted today to trim a \$150,000,000 foreign relief program to \$200,000, and to deny aid to Russian dominated countries unless they agree to rigid U.S. supervision.

Both actions were tentative.

Likewise tentatively, the House voted 136 to 72 to specify the countries entitled to the aid—Italy, Greece, Hungary, Austria, Poland, and China



Michigan State has a great future. With a fully informed student body actively championing the solutions to State's major problems, MSC's future will be assured.




