BERLIN, May 16 (AP)—The American military governor of Hesse told the German people tonight that the death penalty will be invoked if necessary to curb disturbances stemming from protests over the shortage of food.

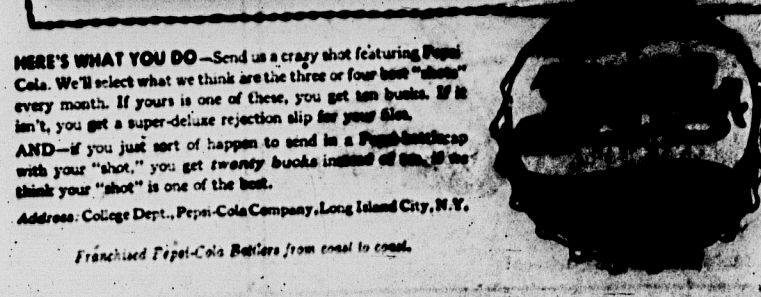

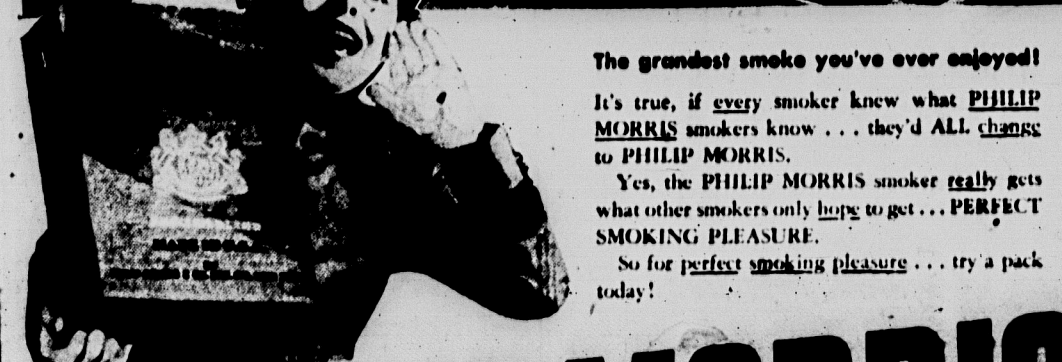
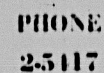

Army Interviews MSC Graduates For Commissions

Graduating seniors, holding a reserve army commission were interviewed for integration in the regular army by a screening board on campus, Wednesday, Colonel John L. Whitely, ROTC commander, announced yesterday.

Monday, the board will be present on the University of Michigan campus. Eligible MSC seniors may appear before it at that time.

Part of the War department's plan to integrate college graduates into the regular army officers corps, applicants must hold a reserve commission in the Army of the United States.

Candidates cannot be over 26½ years of age and must graduate before July 15. Borderline cases may be considered by the board, however.

Certificates of service and all test papers should be presented to the board. Successful applicants will receive their commissions sometime next September, according to the War department release.
