Many students simply cannot make ends meet on the present allotment. To Lansing merchants and other business

On this same day, Sept. 21, the Inter-City coach line raised its Lansing-East Lansing fare, not 10, or even 20, but 100 percent. The rate increase reeks vith discrimination against the Michigan State college student body. It puts the squeeze on every student who travels from Lansing to East Lansing to attend classes here, as well as on every student who must travel to Lansing in pursuit of business or any pensure he can af-For the single veteran living in Lansing who is getting \$65 a month to pay for. room, board, loundry, insurance, travel and amusement, the 20 cents a day he must pay for bus fare automatically takes 10 per cent of his subsistence for transportation.




