Fire Kills Ten, Suspect Arson Officials Say

CHICAGO, Oct. 10 (AP) — Ten burned bodies were recovered today from a 92-flat tenement building on the near northwest side after fire raged through the structure last night.

Authorities sought to determine whether the blaze which killed five women and five children, and injured a dozen other Negro residents of the four-story brick building was started by a firebug.

An arson investigation was begun by Earl Thompson, assistant city corporation counsel, after William Corbitt, 43, the father of the dead of seven flames, was found up the stair well and a blackened coffee can with a string keyhole was found near the foot of the stairs.

The dead women and children perished on the two top floors of the building. Most of those injured jumped from windows of their flats as flames roared into their rooms.

Seven persons jumped into fire nets and others were able to escape without injury from lower floor windows and by the fire escape. Access to the fire escape was blocked to many by the fire in the stair halls.

VETERANS who do not notify the VA of intended marriages are liable to lose part of their increase in subsistence.

Charles C. Calkin, VA contact officer on campus, announced yesterday that increased subsistence is retroactive to the date of marriage regardless of when the VA is notified, he stated. This has cost many students large sums of money, he pointed out.

An increase in subsistence is only awarded by the VA from the date they receive notification. Letters are supplied in the VA office, South campus, which are used to notify central office of the intended marriage.

After the wedding, it is necessary for a certified copy of the public record or photostat.
