It was in Danzig that Dr. Leon-hardt collided with expending national socialism which sought to engulf Danzig. He worked to gain support for the democratic freedoms for the city conferring with English, French and Polish parliamentary groups, but in 1938 Naz encroachment forced him to flee.

Leonhardt received his PhD. from the University of Chicago in 1941. Previously he had studied in Munich, Frieburg and Berling. He holds the highest degree


