

PARIS, Oct. 16 (P)—The first break in France's pre-election strikes came today when 3,000 of the 70,000 idle workers voted to return to their jobs, but there still were few signs that foot-weary Parisians would ride to work tomorrow.
Two independent unions, controlling approximately a tenth of the more than 30,000 striking bus and subway workers, voted to end their three-day walkout, but the Communist - dominated General Confederation of Labor which embraces the remaining nine-tenths urged its forces to stand pat.
