Enrollment Sets Spring Record; 13,602 Register

Records Show Drop Normal,
Says Linton; Ratio Of Men
To Women, Three To One

Approximately 13,600 students will have registered at Michigan State University this week, making it the largest spring enrollment in history, according to Registrar Robert Linton.

Compared with spring term of 1947, this year's enrollment shows winter enrollment of 1948 last spring increase of 1,612. Last spring the official enrollment was 12,562.

Of the total registration approximately 8,000 students are men and 5,600 are women.

The G.I. Bill of Rights does not require veterans to register under the bill because they are not eligible.

Figures released Tuesday showed the ratio of men to women was more than three to one. Last year 4,428 men registered compared with 3,180 women, and registered. This year the ratio of men to women is expected to be approximately 3,000 to 2,600.

Data Given
To Truman*

WASHINGTON, March 31
— President Truman received the report of his fact-finding board in the soft coal strike today but put off his next move "pending the study."

Charles Ross, press secretary, said the report would not be made public until Tuesday. He would not say what the president would do about the 10-day-old coal strike in the meantime.

That seemed to delay, at least until Saturday, the chance of a court injunction to halt the strike over miners' pension. But actually, says Mr. Truman, a choice is born the way of miners on John L. Lewis for a change. The United Mine Workers president in the past has kept the White House guessing as to his plans.

Meanwhile, the Justice Department papers ready to seek a court injunction against Lewis if the executive comes from the White House.

However, some officials are not certain that even an injunction would send the miners back to work. They say it might be hard to enforce because Lewis denies he inspired the walkout. He says the miners simply resented the failure of the operators to set up a pension system under their contract.

There is only one explanation for the surprising unanimity of the House in deciding that Spain should be included in the Marshall Plan.

Wrestlers Place Second In NCAA Meet

Spartan Mat Squad Adds Tourney Honors To String Of Nine Dual Meet Wins

An undefeated dual meet season and second place in the NCAA tourney last month gave the 1948 Spartan wrestling team the distinction of posting the best record in Michigan State's mat history.

According to coach Fendley Collins, it was his first perfect dual meet season in the 19 years he has been at State and the closest he has ever come to annexing the national collegiate crown.

In the nationals, the Spartans placed men in five of the eight weight classes to roll up a 28-point total for the second place cup, five markers behind the pace-setting Oklahoma A & M team. Dickenson Takes First-Place

Dick Dickenson, in the 136-pound division, took the only first for State, and Gale Mikles and Bob Maldegan placed second in the 165-pound and heavyweight brackets. The other two that placed were Don Anderson and Gene McDonald with fourths in the 147-pound and 125-pound classes, respectively.

In winning the 136-pound title, Dickenson was the only individual champion who failed to score a fall in any of his bouts. However, this was no discredit for the lightweight as the draw pitted him against the five toughest men in his division.

Mikles Faces Champ

Mikles, State's top scorer all season, also faced none too well in the early round drawing. In the first round he faced Bill Nelson, defending 165-pound champ, and he met Oklahoma's Jim Eagleton in the third round, winning both bouts on decisions.

The title bout between Mikles and Jack St. Clair, of A & M, was one of the most exciting of the meet with the latter receiving the nod on a split decision.

After the loss to St. Clair, Mikles had to meet Don Mullison for second place but he won easily with a fall in slightly over seven minutes.

Maldegan Loses To Hutton

In the heavyweight class, Maldegan had little trouble in walking off with second place honors. Outside of his loss to Dick Hutton of Oklahoma A & M, who won the title, Bob had little difficulty with the other contenders, scoring three falls in the other four bouts.

Nebraska's Mike D'Bois, who bowed to the Spartan heavyweight in the final dual meet of the season, gave Maldegan his best scrap but Bob pinned him in 13:12.

The 125-pound, fourth-round tussle between McDonald and Iowa Teachers' Gerald Leeman, provided one of the highlights of the tourney as the Spartan坦然 pinned his man in less than five minutes.

McDonald Tops Leeman

Leeman was rated as the favorite in that weight class and had previously defeated McDonald in the first meet of the season. The low man won the 126-pound NCAA crown in 1946 and was named as the outstanding wrestler of the tournament but injuries prevent-




