

MSC Library And Why

A LARGE AMOUNT OF DISCUSSION has been kicked around campus concerning the deplorable condition of library facilities.

The most general argument is that the college, is spending thousands on campus beautification, technology buildings and athletic development while the scholastic side of college limps along on a few tattered

One explanation for the present library situation is a lack of foresight, when fore-sight was practically impossible. The time goes back to late 1944 and early 1945 when the federal government provided building priority to begin building programs on American campuses

Thus under the Civilian Production Administration the U.S. government gave the go ahead to collegiate expansion so that when the war was over the campuses across the nation would be better able to cope with the deluge of students anticipated after the passage of the G. I. Bill.

SO THE STATE OF MICHIGAN, HAVing somewhere close to 30 million on hand, set up a college building program. Seven million was slated for Michigan State.

The Board of Agriculture submitted a list of needed buildings, in order of importance, for consideration. It so happened that the seven million limit went only as far as the library on the list, but not including it.

At the time, the Ag Board evidently considered the need for new classroom and technical education buildings more important than a new library. The need for the new buildings for a half a dozen departments for some reason seemed more important than providing for the entire college a sadly lacking means to study.

YES, IT IS TRUE THAT THE TERRIFIC influx of post war college students could in no way be anticipated back in March of 1945 when the new building program had to be approved. But still it seems that the Ar Board was not looking to the best interests of education when it saw fit to place the need of expanded library facilities so far down on the list.

A library is not a mere collection of mysteries and westerns, it is the most vital factor of a modern educational system. And we do not here intend to say that it is the whole factor.

But it does seem that classroom and laboratory facilities are not the whole factor either. It appears that the board at that time gave them undue import-

In addition, a textile finish was developed that combined just the right amount of plasticizing action and lubricating power, allowing the filaments to twist evenly in forming the cord. A new addesive was prepared to join the yarn with rubber. New twisting techniques for cord manufacture were found, since the usual methods caused loss in rayon

Engineering Problems Solved

Chemical and mechanical engineers were faced with the design and operation of equipment for more than 15 different types of unit operations. Equipment had to operate every minute of the day, yet turn out perfectly uniform yarn. It was necessary to filter the viscose so carefully that it would pass through spinning jet holes less than 4,1000th of an inch without plugging. Some of the most exacting temperature and humidity control applications the chemical industry were required.




