

The board had warned a year ago that prices might be raised, but put it off until absolutely necessary. Increases in both college wages and food prices were given as the reason, At the next registration, dormitory men will shell out \$188

for room and board; thirteen dollars more than this term. Women will pay \$193, a raise of eight dollars.

This increase has been mirrored all over the nation in past months as congress, intimidated by looming dections, refused to take the strong measures necessary to clamp the lid






