# A Question of Values

Is a student more valuable to his country in college or in

According to the President's latest directive on selective service, 5,000 men out of approximately 8,500 now enrolled at MSC could continue their schooling.

This is on the basis of grades alone. Aptitude tests scheduled for college students during the next two months will also count toward deferment.

The principle of college deferment is well-foun An undergraduate is no more use to the military than a completely untrained individual.

If students were drafted after going through college, they could serve more effectively with specialized knowledge. The armed forces save time and money by drafting only ready-trained personnel. Students in essential fields are left to complete their own training.

The combat fraining of all draftees is a legitimate expense. But there is no excuse for spending taxpayer's money on specialized instruction for men who would have financed it themselves.

The armed forces were notorious with World War II veterans for their collossal disregard of ability and aptitude

Untrained men who are drafted have a slimmer chance for assignment in the field where they would be most valuable. There is no guarantee of more efficiency in assignment if men are drafted regardless of their scholastic standings, at the same time there would be much heavier expenditure. The military is backing the deferment program with a "stay in school"

Grades and aptitude tests are not the only things which determine deferments. Local draft boards have the final Board members who live in the student's community should be able to detect students who look like good material on paper, but are only collegiate draft-dodger

Men who can stay in college are not exempted from the draft. They are only deferred. And there is not much chance that they will escape the draft.

Most experts agree that the crisis with Russia will take years, perhaps generations, to solve. The armed forces will draft men as long as American security is threatened. College graduates are more draft-liable because of their special know-how.

The deferment system is not perfect, but takes the

greatest advantage possible of present conditions. This does not betittle the supreme sacrifice of the fighting man, it is simply a hard fact of war.

# Michigan State Television

A full time television curriculum built around MSC facilities will be inaugurated next fall.

Although other Big Ten schools offer courses in TV. Michigan State will be the only Western Conference school with such a complete curriculum.

Only one other school in the country. Syracuse university, has complete control over its TV facilities. MSC is the only school in the Big Ten not using a commercial station for its television work

Professor Wilson B. Paul, head of the speech, dramatics and radio education department, cited the forthcoming TV curriculum as the "most complete in the United States,"

All this is fine. It will be another feather in the Spartan helmet. But the program is really significant as a venture into a new field of education.

The TV program has a two-fold purpose: fo instruct students in the techniques of TV production and operation; and to provide an educational medium for the public. The first will be fulfilled next fall. TV instruction will

be directed by Dr. Armand L. Hunter, recognized nationally for his work in educational television.

Public broadcasting must wait for a channel transfer te East Lansing. The request is now before the Federal Communications commission.

The advantages of a college TV system are numerous The studie will be open for observation by students in courses dealing with TV. Opportunities for research are endiess; there will be no commercial shackles. The studio can also offer facilities for a complete study of TV as an educational medium

Television is still in its infancy, as an art and as a business. MSC is helping it grow up.

# **Draft-Age** Men Should Go to School

The draft law guarantees high school students freedom from induction until they leave school flunk, graduate or turn 20, whichever happens first. Furthermore, selective service says few of its 4,000 local boards have yet dug into the 19-year-

Orders went to navy recruiters in 1948 that they were to entact high school students only through established channel usually through the principa Furthermore, they were to tal niors and about en-

only to seniors—and about en-listing after graduation.

Educators are enthusiastic about the navy's school policy.

The National Council for the Mobilization of Education says it was concerned last fall that none of the other services

an active and clearly-stated stay-in-school policy-Meetings were held in Octo-ber, and November with the armed services and the U. S. office of education. The Na-tional Council says it forms betional Council says it found the services most cooperative when they realized what the problem

The result of the meetings was directives from the army, air force and Marine corps to their recruiters not to influence students to leave school. The other services have since started compiling occupational hand-books similar to the navy's.

The women's services are the

only ones requiring a high school education for actual enlistment. A high school education or its equivalent is required for army officer candidate school (OCS) Two years of college are required for both air force OCS and air cadet training. And a college degree is required for all naval and Marine reserve commissions. Educators and the armed ser-

vices now agree not only that an educated serviceman is a better serviceman but that the more schooling he has the easier he is sify and assign. He has had a chance to indicate his ap-titudes in school.

Where did that episode occur? The women's section at the Detroit House of Correction? Nope. The WAC drill field at Fort Lee, Va.? Nope. The women's phys. ed class at Michigan State College? You're getting warmer. at Michigan State College?

It happened on Old College field at MSC. It was the first squad, first plateon, A company of the MSC ROTCCC, 1970 A.D. The MSC ROTCCC is the Michigan State College reserve officers training cadet coed corps.

In that year Michigan State had the nation's outstanding coed officer's training program. Coed enrollment remained about stationary since 1952 when it was instituted but male enrollment has been jumping ever since. . . . .

First possibilities of the program were brought to the campus in early April, 1951 by Sue Merriman, head of the AWS judiciary board. She had just attended the Intercollegiate AWS national convention at Purdue university. She reported in the student daily on April 12 of that year that possibilities of a woman's ROTC were discussed.

The idea spread like wildfire. General Douglas Mac-Arthur, back from Tokyo under strained circumstances, read from a copy of The State News during a report to the administration that week. He said that Miss Merriman's words were good. That was it.

Michigan State, already having one of the outstanding male reserve officers' programs was immediately picked as pilot ground for the new breed of women college students. Things didn't go too well at first. There was confusion.

The Counselor for Women's office refused to allow advanced cadet officers to refer to their light tan skirts as Traditionally male army officers had used the terms "pinks" or "pink pants" in describing their trousers. This was ruled out in the coed cadet corps.

Next came the question of service ribbons. Some coeds insisted on wearing the fraternity pins they had collected, in much the same way that men were their battle ribbons. The defense department agreed with the possible connection but said the whole thing was bad for morale.

Coed cadet military honoraries sprang up. First came Powder and Puff. This was for the cream of the coeds similar to Scabbard and Blade. Then there was the Officer-ette's Club and the Green and White Protectors to feminine Spartan Guard).

Powder and Puff women got in trouble immediately. They made their pledges march around the men's dorms at 7 in the morning for a week before their initiation. The trouble came, not because the men didn't like it, but because they liked it too well. The men acted as though coeds were coeds, regardless of their military bearing.

All is well now with the coed trainees. Some have even distinguished themselves in the field.

Distinguished coed cadet Matilda Broadbeam has been recognized as the leading authority in coffee and doughnut deployment. Other MSC coeds have gone almost as far.

Michigan State scored another first with its military coeds. May enemy armies rest in peace.
