### Enrollment Drop Prompts Request

The house wives and means committee yesterday recommended legislative appropriation for MSC staff salary increases and to make up for fees lost through declining student enrollment.

## Fresh Men Must Live on Campus

### Ag Board Passes Ruling for Fall '51

All freshmen and transfer students must live in the dormitories their first year of residence at MSC, according to a ruling passed by the State Board of Agriculture yesterday. The regulation goes into effect fall term, 1951.

The new ruling will apply only to men students. A similar regulation for coeds has been in effect for a number of years.

Exceptions to the new regulation must be approved by Tom King, dean of students. Students may bypass the rule under the following conditions:

#### Some Cases Exempted

If they live with parents or close relatives, if they are married or 25 years of age, if they need to live in private homes to earn room and board, if it is recommended by the college health service, or in other cases where there is ample justification.

Commenting on the new regulation, Dean King said: "Spending the first year in college housing will provide a better start—a smoother adjustment—for new students."

#### Crucial Period

He pointed out that the first year of transition to college life is a crucial period for the success or failure of the student in his college career. This is particularly true now, that older veterans have departed, he said.



### No Favorites


Don says that he doesn't have a favorite club because "you have to like 'em all." However, "I guess that I save most strokes with a putt on the green."
