a la mode-Double Think

In George Orwell's book, "1984," Big Brother controls the masses by having them think in a special way. It is called doublethink Big Brother (this title includes the ruler and all other

governmental agencies) cuts the chocolate ration. But the Big Brother controlled radio does not say the ration has been cut. Instead it says the ration has been increased although

the new ration is actually smaller. The people believe the ration is larger even though they know it is smaller. After the announcement the audience gives a big cheer for Big Brother. This is known as doublethink.

There are two other countries in the world, East Asia and Eurasia. Big Brother is continually at war with one and has an alliance with the other.

One day the masses hate Eurasia and love East Asia. But the next day Big Brother may go to war with East Asia and form an alliance with Eurasia. The masses do not know whom to hate and whom to love.

But this does not bother them. They hate and love who ever Big Brother tells them to. Another example of

That a thing like doublethink could exist may seem ridiculous to you—impossible for the human mind to think that way. If you think this you haven't been reading some of our "better" newspapers or listening to some of our "better" commentators lately.

Before the MacArthur issue there was a large group that persistently criticized the President for his aggressive policy in Korea. They ran full page editorials urging the to get out of Korea. They ran front page cartoons depicting President Troman as a war monger leading us into a third World War.

They brought in testimony from mothers whose sons were killed in Korea. They had testimony from wounded soldiers. And they wound up their masterpieces of propaganda with flag waving appeals for our forces to leave Korea for the sake of our nation. We need our troops here to protect our shores, they said.

Now comes the process of doublethink.

After the MacArthur firing these same papers started shouting for aggression. Give MacArthur a free hand, they said. Bomb bases in China. Transport the national troops to the Chinese mainland.

Over night the pacifist tune of these papers changed to aggression. All thoughts of leaving Korea had left their little heads. They are well along the road to doublethink.

It is a very grave and important issue. The final decision will effect the nation. In this very important issue the majority of the legislators split down party lines. It must take a special type of thinking to think the way party leaders tell you.

I have invented a new type for MSC students-nonthink. The morning after MacArthur was fired one of my instructors reluctantly brought up the topic. Immediately 90 per cent of the class wanted to voice their "firm" de-

A few were given the opportunity and tempers started to flare. Then the instructor asked, "How many of you have been following the case?" Only three or four students raised their hands. A very good example of nonthink.

There are many other examples of doublethink and non-

The idea that the world is arming for peace. We are arming for war-everybody knows it. Only they don't

If General MacArthur believes himself when he says he will "just fade away," he is doing a good job of double-Anyone who appeals on the emotions the way he did and goes parading about the country does not intend to fade away.

The responsible male student on campus can see reason for not allowing beer and cars on campus and then forms a mob and charges the women's dorms.

There are a lot more examples. If you wanted to you could find some by yourself.

Only most people like doublethink. They like to ignore the facts and think the way they want.





Safari Stunt by Spartan

All West Afriean students have condemned the show staged by the safari members, which depicted the African people dressed in rag half naked, and at the service of a "white boss."

I question the authority of

these actors on either contemp-orary or past African life. The show painted Africa and her people in the most unnatural and false colors.

There might have been a time

when African people were maked and primitive. The pages of his-tory tell us that people of all races were once primitive.

Africa had her primitive period, but this is no justification for a bunch of college students to

a bunch of college students to caricature the Africans.

It is most insulting to see a show giving college youngsters a false impression about Afri-cans whose homes, towns, cities, and countryside these novice actors have never seen.

In a great institution like this which attracts people from all over the world it is most embarrassing to put up with such a false show about Africa.

The safari members are trying to make students from one con-tinent bitter. They can never soil the good impression which the leadership of President Hannah and his able lieutenants have given to the African students.

It is to avert a further attempt create bitterness that African students unanimously protest

here and we can show Africa as she truly is if there is need for anyone in this student body who may want to learn

Travelers to Africa speak volumes on the hospitality and the hindliness of African people to strangers. But the "white boss" in this mafari took advantage of African hospitality and showed them as boys.

They have made pictures of Africans to show the world, not as the Africans are, but as they imagined the Africans to be.

This goes to make up the whole body of impression which a great many American Negroes have given Africans studying in this coun-

If they have no reason to be proud of Africa, I do not blame them. But the true representa-tives of Africa are proud of their fatherland which has been so falsely presented to this campus.

Student Hits Pitt Teachers Protest Pay

Teachers at the University of Pittsburgh submitted to the University senate-recently a "scorching" report on salaries at that institution. The report said that pay is far below national and local averages, and has lagged behind the raises in cost of living.

It is also pointed out that teachers are in danger of losing some extra income from summer school and evening classes because of the drop in enrollment. Teacher's base pay, the report said, is now "lower than the average mill-worker's."


