

## '78 Retired to Showcase

### Coleman's Jersey Gets Honored Spot in Jenison

Tackle Don Coleman, an unanimous All-American selection, received an added honor in his home town on Dec. 14, when Coach Clarence "Biggie" Munn announced that Coleman's jersey number, 78, never again would be used on a Spartan uniform.

It marks the first time in Michigan State football history that a football jersey number has been permanently retired. Coleman's jersey will be placed in a trophy case in Jenison Gym, a reminder to visitors in future years of the great tackle who played on the 1949, '50, and '51 Michigan State football teams.

Munn presented the jersey to Coleman at a civic luncheon in Flint before a turn-away crowd of 400 at the Elks Club.

The retirement of his jersey number was one more thrill for Coleman, who was named to every All-American team.

He also placed second in the Sporting News selection as Player of the Year, was barely edged in the close voting for Look magazine's "Outland Award" given to the nation's outstanding guard or tackle of the year, and was tied for second place in the AP's "Linebacker of the Year" award.

The Notre Dame squad chose him on their all-opponent team for the third straight year, the first time in the school's history that a player has been named three times.

The Spartans' backstroke pride, Bob Shoup, seventh in the nation last season, will battle it out for honors with Iowa State star, Andersson. Both have established themselves as top men in collegiate backstroking.

The University of California at Los Angeles and the University of Southern California will participate in this program, and candidates for Master of Science Degrees must meet entrance requirements for advanced study at these schools.

### PROGRAM

Under this Cooperative Plan, starting June 1952, the following schedule of employment at Hughes is arranged:

### SALARIES

### TUITION

Tuition at either UCLA or USC, covering the required number of units necessary to obtain a Master's Degree, will be paid by Hughes Research and Development Laboratories.

### NUMBER OF AWARDS

Approximately one hundred Cooperative Awards shall be made each year, if sufficient qualified candidates present themselves.

### SELECTION OF CANDIDATES

Candidates will be selected by a committee of representation composed of two each from the University of California at Los Angeles, the University of Southern California, and the Hughes Research and Development Laboratories.

Informal applications should be mailed prior to January 30, 1952. The Laboratories will then forward formal applications, which should be returned, accompanied by up-to-date grade transcripts, by February 15, 1952. Selections will be made during the month of March.

Intercollegiate action will keep Michigan State teams busy in basketball, wrestling, swimming, and hockey during the coming week, the first big week of the winter sports season.

Petitions may be obtained at the activities desk in the Union Board office on the first floor of the Union building. They are to be returned to the same place.

The petitions will be reviewed, and members will be held in the Union at a later date. Members will be selected by the Merit Committee and the Board of Directors, both student committees within the Union Board. Just how many will be selected depends upon how many of the present members graduate or fail to reapply for positions, Pingry said.

Pingry and Miss Bruhm head the newly reorganized publicity committee. The outgoing committee, formerly headed by Pingry, has been disbanded. The board felt there was too little interest in excursions to Detroit hockey games, plays and the like to continue the group, Kay Myers, Board secretary, explained.

Board members have been studying the file of information about student unions elsewhere in an attempt to provide a more complete program, Pingry said.

John Green, Board music chairman, has arranged a music program for the term, including the Sunday community sings scheduled on the Union calendar, Pingry said.

Mike Drummond is planning additional movie dances, the publicity co-chairman stated. These dances are held in the Union ballroom while feature films showing well-known or obscure are run off. Couples will dance to the music from the film sound-track, while the film is shown on the screen.

The board now has a movie projector given them by alumni through William L. Davidson, director of the Michigan State College fund. Responsible groups may use the machine if they will pay for its operation.


