Editorially

Un-American

After considerable advance publicity and promises of sweeping disclosures, the House Un-American Activities Committee is conducting its roadshow inquiry into Communist activities in Michigan.

The hearings are a prime example of the worst method of combating Communism:

In our recollection, one of the major differences between our form of government and the Soviet brand has been the emphasis placed on the rights of the individual in America in contrast to the almost complete lack of

Basic to the protection of the individual under our system is the right to be presented with charges against oneself and the opportunity to answer them on the same forum they were made.

The members of the committee are making little effort to uphold our system in their inquiry.

Early this week one Detroit paper printed the names people mentioned in the inquiry as being active in the Michigan Communist Party. The damage caused to the careers and reputations of these people and their families would be hard to gauge.

Under such circumstances it is probably of small comfort to the witnesses subpoensed by the Wood Committee that they may submit written statements to the committee for inclusion in the record. They are given no opportunity to present an oral argument in their behalf.

The information now splashed over the pages of the Detroit press adds nothing to the knowledge of the government agency charged with investigating such activi-ties—the Federal Bureau of Investigation. In fact the major disclosures have been made by FRI agents.

In the past corrective legislation from the committee has been meager indeed. The main function of Chairman Wood's group seems to be to garner as much personal publicity for its members as possible, all of it at public expense and often, as at present, while the members have other work to do in Washington.

The action of House Speaker Sam-Rayburn in banning television, radio and newsreels along with kleig lights and microphones from the committee hearings helps to give the affair some semblance of a respectable inquiry

Public airing of such information may help in arousing public awareness of Communist activities. But the methods employed by the Un-American Activities Committee far ontweigh any possible benefits so derived.

Important Election

Today coeds will vote for presidents of AWS Activities and Judiciary Boards and living unit representatives of those Boards.

The Judicisty Board, with the Administration, makes and executes the rules by which coeds must abide. The Activities Board acts as a central governor of campus activities for women. AWS is an important factor in coed daily living.

The women elected today will serve for one year. They will make laws and regulate 3,000 coeds in countless ways. Activities Board will try to foster interest in campus activities and impose limitations on entering too many activities. The Judiciary will decide many dormitory rules and judge appeals and petitions made by coeds:

All the candidates have excellent academic and social records. Each one is as qualified to hold office as the next. All are sincere in their desires to improve AWS and

-AN'S was designed to serve the basic needs of coeds. The organization represents all the women on campus. It is their duty to vote for the candidates they feel can best serve their interests.
