





















# Theme Music Due For Carnival Floats

Auditions for Two Announcers Set for Tomorrow Night in Aud

The 28 living units entered in the Water Carnival must hand in one song choice for each float Tuesday from 2 to 5 p.m. in the Wolverine office, Ward Ouradnik, committee chairman, announced.

A theme song to tie in with the film and sequence will be picked by the Water Carnival Committee. The traditional King and Queen float will precede the show down the Red Cedar.

Another float is being planned by the Committee but will not be considered in the prize competition, Ouradnik added.

Two announcers will be picked at auditions Tuesday night at 9:30 in room 340 of the Auditorium, Phyllis Phipps, theme committee chairman, stated. Previously, only one announcer has been used.

The job of announcing all the copy for the floats, in addition to the entire continuity, requires more than one announcer, the committee feels. More than one voice will give better variation to the audience during the approximately two and a half hour length of the show, the committee added.

"Discontinuation of the Land Parade will provide more time and funds to improve the Water Carnival," Ouradnik stated, "and the plan of having two announcers is the first in a series of 'dressing up' steps being taken for the show's betterment."

Even though they may borrow up to \$700, are the best risk. If payment is delayed all the college has to do is call the embassy of the student's country. The money is always returned promptly.

Although Pagan can't help students every time, he can direct them to another agency which can handle their problems. A veteran who came to him about a loan to set up a small business finally made financial arrangements with the East Lansing State Bank.

Veterans whose checks are overdue can go to the Michigan Veterans' Trust Fund. Their only qualification must be a recommendation as a good citizen.

Either short-term or long-term loans may be granted from the college loan fund. Short-term loans which must be paid back within the term can be made on Pagan's discretion. Long-term loans which extend for more than one quarter are subject to the approval of a faculty commission composed of the dean of students, the counselor for women, the college controller, the scholarship director, the registrar, and the college secretary.

Various grants and bequests have brought the college loan fund to its present \$35,000.

The time of examinations in sections other than Basic courses are determined by the days and hours the class is scheduled during the term. To determine when your examination is to be given, find the block in Columns 2, 4, 5 or 6 which lists the days and hours of your class. The column heading will indicate the time of day and column 1 will then give the date on which your examination is to be held.

Examinations for courses other than Basic courses will be given in the same classroom as assigned for class meetings at the end of the term. All students, instructors, and room schedules will automatically clear if all courses follow this schedule.

NOTE: At least two of the days and hours must follow the regular pattern. In a few courses, at the request of the department concerned, the final examination has been scheduled by the single hour lecture section and in some instances students may encounter conflicts. In that event, the examination scheduled by the class meeting two hours a week would take precedence over the examination scheduled by the single hour lecture. The examination would have to be arranged between the student and the department requesting the special scheduling of its examination.
