One of the minor problems coach Burgie Mann faced this season was finding someone to do the place kicking, both on kickoffs and for extra points. For the past two and one-half seasons the job had been handled by the able Bob Carey, the All-American end who graduated in June and is now with the Los Angeles Rams.

Because of the short length of time during spring practice, Mann had to put aside the problem and deal with more pressing matters.

Last season, when Carey was injured, Gene Lekenta, a 20-year-old sophomore, was moved up from the junior varsity squad for the kickoffs. His performances in the several games he played warranted him another shot this season.

Saturday against Michigan, he had five kickoffs, each time after a Michigan State touchdown and a kick that opened the second half.

His first kick sailed down to the Michigan seven-yard line and was followed by another to the Wolverine three.

Lekenta's third kick was his poorest, and was taken at the Michigan 24-yard line by a Wolverine end. His fourth kickoff, which started the second half, traveled to the six and his final boot carried to the opponents' three-yard line again.

Another felt that it deserved praise was Evan Slone, the pony fullback. Besides playing a good offensive game, Slone took care of the conversions and hit on three out of four attempts.

Coach Karl Schladerman's harriers have been running up to ten miles a day in preparation for the defense of their Big Ten cross-country crown. Should they defend it successfully, they will become the first Spartan athletic squad to win more than one Big Ten championship.

And the chances look good. For the team which last fall finished first in the Western Conference, fourth in the NCAA and fifth in the NCAA has returned almost intact.

Leading the returning contingent is Jim Keppard, Muskegon senior who led MSC's entry last year by taking fourth in the Big Ten. His running mates include Jerry Zerbe, Flint senior; Wayne Smith, Pontiac, N.Y. senior; Dick Farrell, Oak Lawn, Ill. senior; John Cook, London, Ont. senior; and Lyle Garber, Calgary, Alberta, junior. Ike Stirs Southern Audience

Byrnes Lashes Out At Administration

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP)—Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower swept into the Southern states for the third time Tuesday and stirred wave after wave of applause when he said of the Truman regime:

"We have an administration which may go down in history as the scandal-a-day administration."

A crowd estimated by Columbia Police Chief L. J. Campbell at "nearly 50,000" massed in front of the white pillared state capitol to hear Eisenhower tear into the Democrats on a wide front of campaign issues.

Eisenhower flew to Columbia from New York Tuesday, beginning an 8,000-mile tour. Gov. James F. Byrnes met him at the airport and they passed through streets lined with people on the way to the capitol.

The general is the first presidential candidate to carry his campaign into South Carolina since the Civil War. And he is the first Republican aspirant to make three appearances in the Southern states.

In introducing Eisenhower, Byrnes called him "a son of the South, born in Texas."

The governor, a lifelong Democrat, said "South Carolina is out of the bag. He referred to assumptions that Southern states normally are in the Democratic bag."

Touching one of the main campaign issues, Byrnes declared: "The people of South Carolina know the job of cleaning up the mess cannot be entrusted to the man who made the mess."

Murray Flanders, assistant press secretary to Stevenson, told newsmen he had gone through about 500 telegrams and that about 99 per cent of them commended the governor.

Flanders said the Chicago address brought the greatest reaction of any since the governor's July speech accepting the presidential nomination.

Stevenson himself went over the message and then put out this statement:

"I have tried to tell the truth about our world as I see it and I am grateful that so many people want to hear it and are eager to live it."

Killingsworth Joins WSB

Dr. Charles C. Killingsworth, head of the department of economics at Michigan State College, was appointed last week by President Truman to serve as vice-chairman of the Wage Stabilization Board. Dr. Killingsworth goes to Washington today and is expected to serve until April 30.

Dr. Killingsworth is a nationally known authority on labor management relations and labor economics, having served as arbitrator in several hundred labor-management disputes. Since 1947 he has served as impartial umpire under the agreement between Bethlehem Steel Corporation and the United Steelworkers of America. 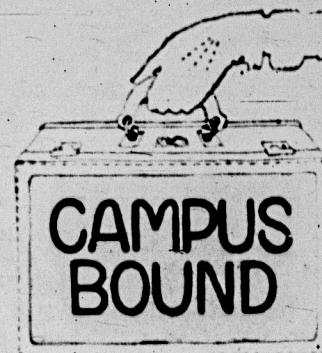
