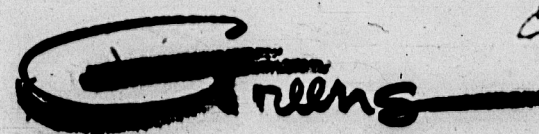

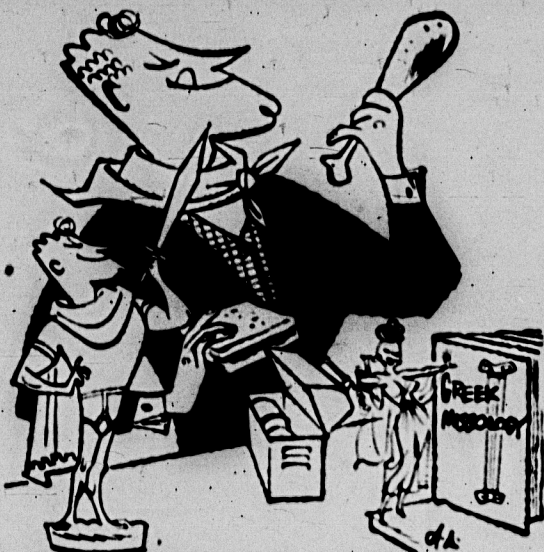

# Spartans Hope to Bag Lion

## Block Races Close In IFC Bowling

Alpha Epsilon Pi, Zeta Beta Tau, Delta Sigma Phi and Delta Chi are the current leaders in their respective blocks in the IFC bowling race, after three weeks of bowling.

In last night's bowling the Delta Sigs, last year's IFC champs, took three points from Phi Kappa Sigma to take first place in their block. They lead Phi Kappa Sigma by one point.

AEPI holds a two and one-half edge over ATO in their block. AGR is also in the race for that block championship—one point behind ATO.

ZBT and Delta Chi are on the verge of making runaways of

their respective blocks. Tuesday night Delta Chi knocked off their closest competitors, the Sigma Chis, with a three-point win and last night swept four from SAE. They now lead Phi Delta Theta by five points. ZBT holds a three-point edge over Sigma Nu in their block.

## Munn Sharpens Offense To Snare Penn Staters

Sharpening their offensive teeth to a razor edge, Coach Biggie Munn's Spartans will take the field Saturday ready to use any trap necessary to bag the Nittany Lion from Penn State.

Such has been the atmosphere around the Spartan practice field this week. Munn, cast in the role of head lion tamer, has introduced a bevy of new plays to spring on the powerful crew from the Quaker State.

Although the Spartans usually run from a straight "T" or the single wing, they have on occasions used variations of other formations. And this week, if need be, the Munnmen may use elements of the double wing, the split "T" and the winged "T."

With the exception of Vince Pianos, who is on the shelf with an ankle sprain, the Spartans should be at full strength for the Penn Staters. Trainer Jack McPinnell announced that all three Spartans who were previously on the doubtful list should be ready by Saturday.

Offensive guard Bob Brenitt, sidelined Tuesday with a pinched neck muscle, was back in the line again yesterday. Tackle Larry Fowler and fullback Wayne Benson, both bothered by ankle injuries earlier in the week, seemed to have thrown off the ill effects of the Syracuse game. Benson, however, has had minor leg troubles all season and may be somewhat handicapped Saturday.

Munn again warned his charges yesterday that they could not afford to let up for Coach "Big" Engle's blue-shirted gridders. Reminding the Spartans that the Nittany Lions have remained unbeaten in four games this season, Munn quipped, "You're going to get some good targets Saturday, because the Penn State boys are just that big."

After a brief pep session yesterday the Spartans went about their business as usual, continuing their efforts to give the alumni a happy homecoming this weekend.

## Old Record Smashed by IM Swimmer

The 1952 All-College Swimming Meet got underway last night with one new meet record established and another barely missed. John Dudeck knocked two-tenths of a second off the record to top the 50-yard breaststroke in 27.8 seconds.

In the 50-yard freestyle, Ross Thompson came within one-tenth of a second of tying the old record of 24.0 set in 1950 by Chuck Baldwin.

The other winner of the evening was Bill Sexton who turned in a fine time of 30.3 to win the 50-yard backstroke. Sexton also came in second in the freestyle. Ervin Wheatley gave Sexton a good race as he finished a close second in the backstroke with a time of 30.5.

The top individual performance of the evening was turned in by John Dudeck, who set the new mark in the breaststroke. Dudeck, a freshman, was the number one high school All-American selection in the breaststroke last year. Others who placed in the three events include: Robin Hesse, third in the freestyle; Dave Powell, third in the backstroke; and John Jeffrey and Bob Reams, who finished second and third respectively in the breaststroke. The meet will be wound up tonight with four more events on the agenda: 100-yard freestyle, 200-yard freestyle, 50-yard medley and diving.

against the three world evils on which Communism thrives—hunger, disease and ignorance.

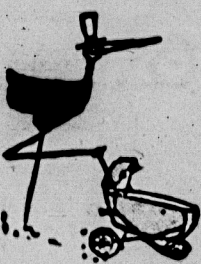
Through technical assistance in these areas to help nations with the basic problems of producing food, reducing disease and providing education, Point Four is in spite of what the critics say—making progress, he said.

Hannah concluded that military aid is essential to victory over Communism, but added that we cannot expect lasting peace unless we can win the goodwill of the millions of hungry, sick and uneducated people in the world.

He offered Point Four as the solution to that basic human problem.

Registration topped the 500 mark at the conference, which concludes its sessions Thursday evening. Forty states and seven foreign countries were represented at the four-day conference.

# Ryukyu Officials at MSC

Three high government officials of the Ryukyu Islands are visiting the MSC campus.

The Department of Political Science has set up a two week program for them to study the form of American government. During the first week, they will receive lectures and instructions from professors of the Political Science Department. The following week they will tour the state and study the functions of our state, county and local governments. They are also scheduled to visit farms in the area to see the life of the American farmer.

Primary purpose of this mission is to study the American form of government, with stress on executive and legislative branches of our state government.

Secondly, they are to study the workings of the county and local government and such functions as our budgeting, banking, taxation and maritime systems.

The three hold very high posts in the Ryukyu central government. Masaru Miyasato is director of the Department of Finance, Masayoshi Harakune heads the Maritime Department and Gempo Hirayama is a member of the legislature.

Michigan State has a special interest in the island where five MSC professors are now teaching. Three Ryukyu professors are now studying at Michigan State.

The Ryukyu Islands are a former part of the Japanese Empire, south of Japan proper. The U.S. has a large airbase there, and now occupies the island, although it has a democratic form of government.
